- In case of courses where the results of qualifying examination conducted by the MDS University are not declared till 22 June 2016, the last date for deposition of admission forms will be extended till the 15th day of the declaration of results by the MDS University. For example if the result for qualifying examination is declared on 2nd July 2016, then the last date to deposit the admission form shall be 17th July 2016. Rest of the Schedule shall be declared on the Notice Board by the concerned department.
- The candidates seeking admission must see the Notice Boards of the concerned department(s) or contact office of the Head of the Department regarding their name on the list for counseling, any change in the schedule and depositing the fees. If any seat remains vacant the new dates shall be notified by the Head of the Department/Incharge and displayed over the Notice Board of the same.
- When reporting for Personal Interview and Document Verification, the candidate must show original mark-sheets, transfer and migration certificates and documents of concession and reservation, if claimed; demand draft of the fee and 2 passport sized photographs between 10.00 am and 1.00 pm, failing which the next candidate in the merit shall be given admission.

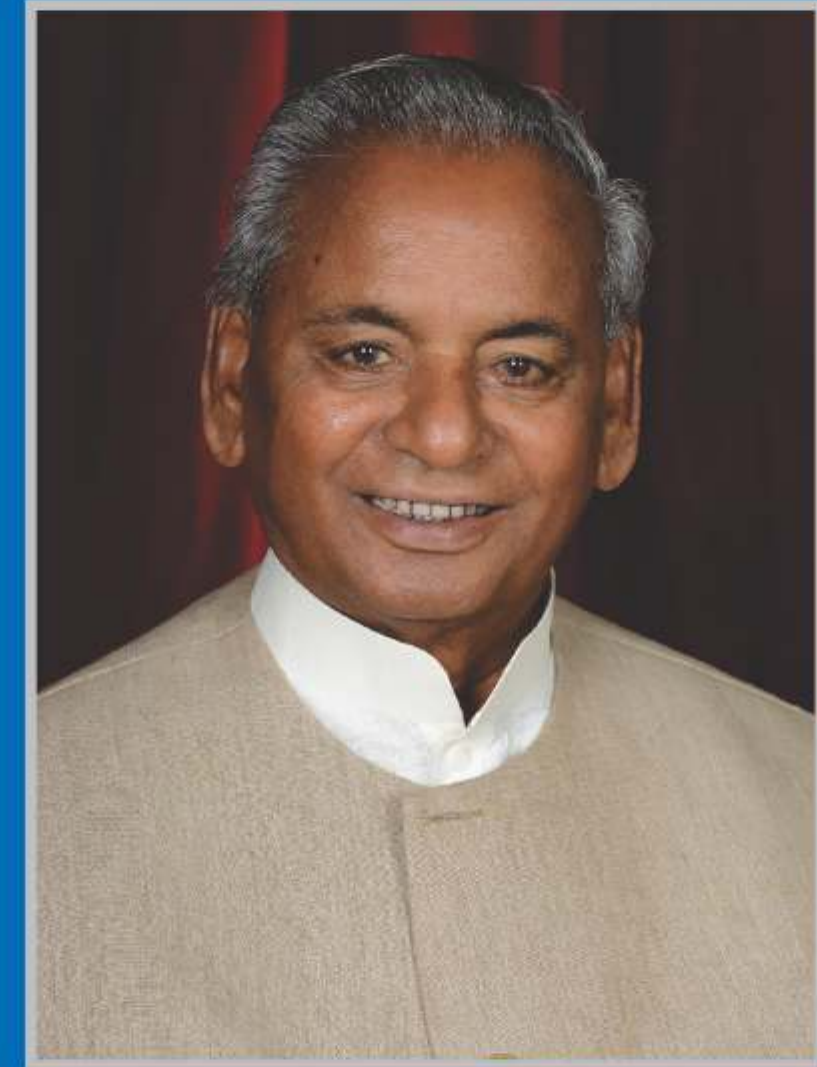

THE UNIVERSITY



The Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer is a comparatively young University of the country which came into existence on 1st August, 1987. Ever since its inception the University has for the last 28 years never settled for a slow pace - it has steadily and successfully marched on the road to development attaining several milestones during its journey of growth and progress. There has been an astonishing growth in the University infrastructure which includes magnificent buildings, Hi-Tech Science Laboratories, a state-of-the-art Computer Centre, a prestigious Library, an Administrative and Examination Block, separate Science, Social Science, Environmental Science, Commerce and Management Blocks and a highly impressive Vice-Chancellor's Secretariat. There has been a simultaneous increase in the number of affiliated colleges and the academic scenario has reached new horizons. There are promising job oriented courses and intensive research oriented programmes. There are also Self Financing Courses in several teaching Departments. The University was accredited as B++ by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore in 2004 and is in the process of reaccreditation by the NAAC. The University Library is unique and the first in the State being fully automated since 2003, having technical and financial support of the UGC's INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad.

The C-Net Centre, EDU-SAT, Campus wide networking using OFC 6 Core are all a reflection of the emphasis of the University to the fact that gaining knowledge can no longer be restricted to the four walls of any institution. There is always scope to explore research and discover while sailing through the process of gaining education.

The Teaching Departments and centres of learning at the university campus include Botany, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Environmental Science, Food Science & Nutrition, Hindi, History, Journalism (Mass Communication), Law, Library and Information Science, Management Studies, Microbiology, Political Science, Population Studies, Pure & Applied Chemistry, Remote Sensing and Geoinformatics, Vedic Vangmaya, Yogic Sciences and Human Consciousness, Zoology, Algae Biofuel and Biomolecules Center (ABBC) and Center for Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management (CESBM), Sindhu Shodhpeeth, Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar Shodhpeeth, Prithviraj Chouhan Ethikasik Evam Sanskritik Shodh Kendra. There are 280 Colleges affiliated to this University, which are spread over 4 districts of the State of Rajasthan. The University registered 271576 students for various courses during the 2015-2016 session.

AJMER

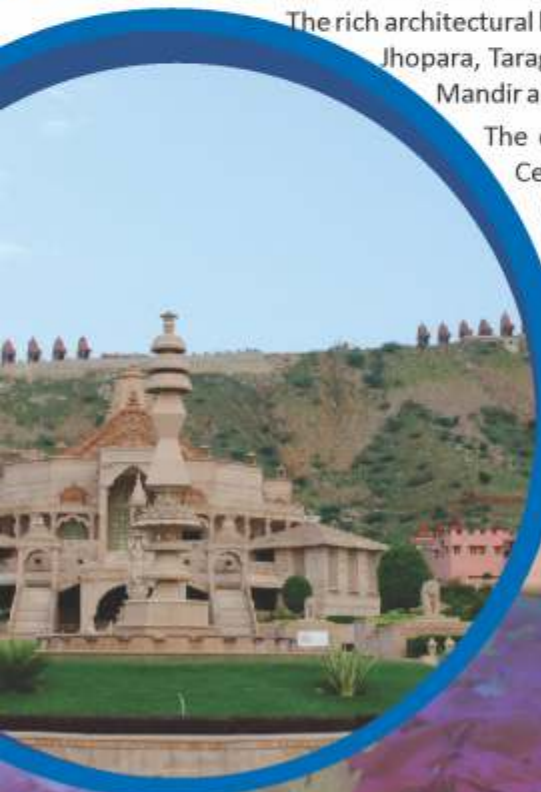


The city of Ajmer was founded in the 7th Century AD. It has been named after King Ajaypal. Ajmer is a city of rich religious and cultural diversity with a unique blend of Hindu, Muslim, Sikh and Christian culture. It is situated in the picturesque valley of one of the oldest mountain ranges of the world - The Aravalis.

All over the world, the city of Ajmer is known for its Dargah, a shrine of the Sufi Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti and Pushkar, a holy pilgrimage lake; supposed to have appeared miraculously, when a lotus flower fell from the hands of Lord Brahma and dropped at this place. The Brahma temple (the only temple of Brahma in the world) is situated at Pushkar.

The rich architectural heritage of Ajmer includes Soni Ji Ki Nasiyan (Jain temple), Adhai-Din-Ka Jhopara, Taragarh Fort, Baradari at Anasagar, Prithviraj Smarak, Nareli, Sai Baba Ka Mandir and Bhakti Dham (Charan Shodh Sansthan).

The city had been a workplace of the great social reformer of the 19th Century, Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati. The name of the University as Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University was given after this apostle of Vedic and Aryan ethos. In addition, Ajmer is an epicenter of educational institutions and is renowned for handicraft work, paintings and as a marble hub at Kishangarh Town which has the biggest marble mandi in Asia.



THE CAMPUS

The Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University is situated in the lap of the Central Aravalli hill ranges, the Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University presents a panoramic view of a mix of beautiful landscape and architecture. It provides a tingling sense of learning environment and creativity for the intellectual growth of the students. The campus spanning over 310 ha of land area is situated by the side of National Highway No. 8 (Ajmer-Jaipur) at a distance of 7 kilometers from Ajmer Bus stand. ELIGIBILITY



Ph.D.

A candidate for admission to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) must have obtained the Master's degree with at least 55 percent marks at the postgraduate examination of the University or an equivalent examination recognized by the University in the subject or any allied subject in which he/she wishes to pursue research. If the candidate secures less than 55 percent marks at the postgraduate examination but has secured second division at postgraduate as well as degree level, he/she will be eligible for admission to Ph. D. Programme.

The candidate seeking admission in Ph.D Programme are advised to go through the ordinance no. 124 relating to the degree of Ph.D. A Separate Advertisement (Admission Notice) will appear in the state level newspapers for Research Entrance Test (RET) only on the availability of seats and admission to the Ph.D. programme in various subjects offered by the University.

M. Phil.

Admission to the M. Phil. Programme will be made on the basis of Entrance Test - the Admission Eligibility Test (AET). A candidate for admission to the courses of study for the degree of M. Phil. must have obtained a Master's degree in the concerned subject with at least 55% marks at the postgraduate examination or Second division at the postgraduate examination with at least second division at the degree examination of the MDS University or of any other University/ Institution.

A separate Admission Notice will appear in the National/Regional Newspapers for "AET- M.Phil." and admission to the M.Phil. Programme in various subjects offered by the University.

In order to fill up reservation quota, relaxation in the eligibility will be given to SC/ST/OBC/SBC/PH etc. up to the pass percentage of the qualifying examination subject to the condition that such person shall not be considered for general category even if he/she secures marks in the merit in AET-M.Phil at the level of the general category .

The AET-M.Phil will be of two papers of 100 marks each. The duration of each papers shall be 1 hr (60 minutes) without any gap. Paper I shall be of Research Aptitude and Paper II shall be on the subject selected by the applicant. If a candidate does not appear in paper I he/she shall not be allowed to appear in Paper II.

- **M.Sc. Botany (Semester Scheme)**
[20 Seats]

Eligibility: 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc. with Botany or B.Sc. Hons. (Botany)

- **M.Sc. Environmental Science (Semester Scheme)**
[20 Seats]

M. Sc. Environmental Science is a program of learning under modular Choice Based Credit System that allows a student exit points after the successful completion of each semester. If the student is successful till the exit point s/he desires to leave at, s/he will be awarded PG Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma/Degree. Such student may return back within two years of exit to seek lateral entry and complete the program. The minimum requirements for such provisions are as below:

Semester 1 (6 months, 20 credits) for PG Certificate in Environmental Science

Semesters 2 (1 year, 40 credits) for PG Diploma in Environmental Science

Semesters 3 (1.5 years, 60 credits) for Advanced PG Diploma in Environmental Science, and Semesters 4(2 years, 80 credits) for M.Sc. Environmental Science

Eligibility: 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc. With Medical or Non Medical group or Bachelor's degree in Environmental Science/Geology/Earth Science/Microbiology/Biotechnology/Biochemistry/Agriculture/Horticulture/Forestry/Wildlife/Life Science

The Department established in 1993 offers M.Sc. Environmental Science course with specialization in Environmental Impact Assessment and Disaster Management, which makes it unique in the country. The course curriculum is extensive and extremely relevant to the present day context. Hands-on-training is provided in laboratory exercises to promote the learning of appropriate environmental technologies. The students are sensitized for the preservation and management of Earth and its resources in a sustainable manner.

- **M.Sc. Foods and Nutrition (Semester Scheme)**
[20 Seats]

Eligibility: 50% marks at Degree level in B.Sc. Home Science (Pass/ Hons. in Foods and Nutrition) or B.Sc. in Foods and Nutrition or B.Sc. with Diploma in Dietetics.

The Department established in 1994 has to its credit the Ajmer chapter of the Nutrition Society of India and has state-of-the-art laboratories. The students undergo intensive internship in Dietetics in reputed hospitals of India and are very well placed in NGO's, Food Industries as dietitians, teachers, health counselors and food inspectors.





- **M.Sc. Microbiology (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**

M. Sc. Microbiology Science is a program of learning under modular Choice Based Credit System that allows a student exit points after the successful completion of each semester. If the student is successful till the exit point s/he desires to leave at, s/he will be awarded PG Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma/Degree. Such student may return back within two years of exit to seek lateral entry and complete the program. The minimum requirements for such provisions are as below:

Semester 1 (6 months, 20 credits) for PG Certificate in Basics Microbiology

Semesters 2 (1 year, 40 credits) for PG Diploma in Microbiology

Semesters 3 (1.5 years, 60 credits) for Advanced PG Diploma in Microbiology and

Semesters 4(2 years, 80 credits) for M.Sc. Microbiology

Eligibility: Min. 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc./B.Sc. (Hons./B.Sc. B.Ed.) in any discipline of biology or B.Sc. (Ag.)

The Department of Microbiology developed a novel approach to remove anions from water by way of interactive biosorption. Its focus on desert microbiology earned it an academic collaboration with the University of Hong Kong and recognition by the Ministry of Environment & Forests as the Prosthecate Bacteria & Micrococcus Centre. The faculty in collaboration with Georgia University, Athens has filed 4 US patents on algae biofuels. With a motto "unveil the hidden strength" the department tries unveiling the hidden strength of the youth and that of our invisible friends.



- **M.Sc. Applied Chemistry (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**

Eligibility: 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc. with Chemistry as one of the optional subjects or in B.Sc. Hons. (Chemistry)

- **M.Sc. Chemistry (SFS) (Annual Semester) [20 Seats]**

Eligibility: 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc. with Chemistry as one of the optional subjects or in B.Sc. Hons. (Chemistry)

The two PG programs run under the auspices of the Department of Pure & Applied Chemistry provide ample job opportunities in industries, laboratories, forensic units and engineering colleges, where students passed out are working. Department conducts Ph.D Program and is well known through the research publications at National and International Level in the field of Bio-monitoring of metals.

- **M.Sc. Remote Sensing & Geo-informatics (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**

Eligibility: Bachelor of Natural, Physical & Earth Sciences/ Geography, Engineering or Master's Degree in Natural, Physical and Earth Science including geography with 55% marks at graduate/ Post graduate level. Candidates should have stereoscopic normal vision.

The Department is unique being the only one of its kind among all universities of the state offering M.Sc. program in this subject. The students are getting placement as Scientist in ISRO and DRDO, State centre of Remote Sensing, Multinational Companies like ROLTA, RMSI, TCI etc. and in foreign countries like Canada, UAE, Belgium, Brazil and USA (NASA). The Department is having many projects sanctioned by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, ISRO and Ministry of Environment and Forests, New Delhi.

- **M.Sc. Zoology (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**

Eligibility: 50% marks in aggregate in B.Sc. with Chemistry and Zoology as optional subjects or B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology

The Department offers Master level programme with Specialization in the Molecular Developmental Biology. Department is equipped with modern facilities for microphotography, DNA sequencing, ultra sensitive biochemistry, sound spectrum analysis, digital alternatives of animal anatomy and physiology and Smart class room.



The Department of Computer Science was established in the year 1994 with a vision to impart quality post graduate education and to carry out leading-edge research in the disciplines of computer science and information technology. The Department is also engaged in research work in Spatial Database Management Systems, Biometrics and Ad-hoc Networking. The Department has well equipped laboratories with state-of-the-art computing facilities supporting teaching and research activities in Open Source, Object Oriented DBMS, Grid Computing and GIS.

- **M.Tech – Computer Science (SFS) 2 years (Semester Scheme) [18 Seats]**
Eligibility: M.Sc. (CS)/M.Sc.(IT), M.Sc. (Physics), M.Sc. (Maths), MCA and B.E./B.Tech with minimum 60% marks

- **MCA – Lateral Entry (SFS) 1 year (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**
Eligibility: M.Sc. (Computer Science), M.Sc. (Information Technology) from any University

- **MCA (Regular) 3 years (Semester Scheme) [20 Seats]**
Eligibility: BCA/B.Sc. (CS/IT)/B.Sc. or Graduate from any discipline with Mathematics as one of the subjects from any recognised University with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

- **MCA – Integrated (SFS) 5 years [15 Seats]**
Eligibility: 10+2 with 60% marks

- M. A. Economics (Annual Scheme) [20 Seats]

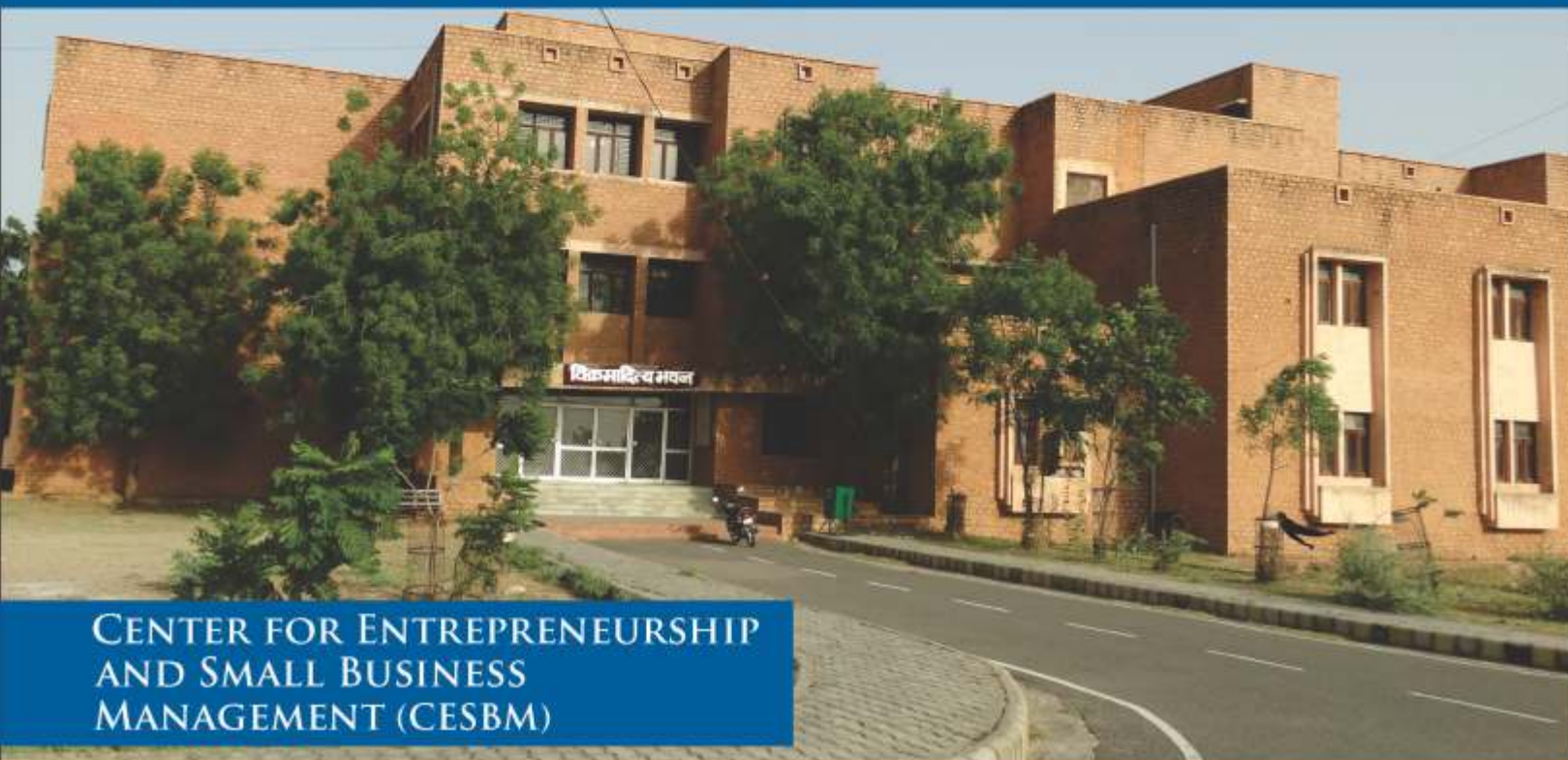

- Candidates indulging in misbehavior with any teacher or with any authority/official of the University.

ADMISSION PROCESS

Admission to various programmes of study in the University is regulated by admission policy and procedure approved by the Academic Council of the University from time to time.

ADMISSION NOTICE

1. Only online applications will be accepted.
2. One may apply for any number of courses by repeating the process of online registration for each course/program of learning.
3. Initiate registering using the icon New Admissions on the website of the University: mdsuajmer.ac.in, mdsuexam.net, mdsuexam.org
4. Collect the payment invoice with challan number at the end of registration and go to any E- mitra or E-mitra website.
5. Submit fee of registration Rs. 300/- per course/program of learning.
6. The E-mitra will provide a 16 digit token number.
7. Now you can go to the website of the University again and fill up the application form. This would require following documents that you may keep handy as scanned copies (The size of single scan file to be uploaded is limited to 300kb):
 - a. Recent passport size photograph
 - b. Any identity card recognized for the government offices viz. Adhar card, Voter card, Driving License etc.
 - c. Registration fee receipt of the E-mitra
 - d. Marksheets of each year of the qualifying examination
 - e. All required certificates as proof to claim reservations, if any.
 - f. All required certificates as proof to claim bonus marks, if any.

ADMISSION COMMITTEE

Head/ In Charge of each department/Director of a Centre shall constitute a Departmental Admission Committee (DAC) to finalize the admissions as per the rules of the University. The Committee will have Head/In Charge of the Department/ Director of the Centre as the Convener of the Admission Committee along with minimum of one faculty member nominated by the Head/In Charge/ Director as Member and the Office clerk as the Member Secretary. The member secretary will maintain the records and assist in the procedures.

Admission Board

PROCEDURE

GENERAL RULES

1. Admission to various post graduate courses shall be offered to those graduates who have passed with the 10+2+3 examination scheme.
2. Students shall not be eligible for admission to a course unless they have passed the qualifying examination or any other examination recognized for the purpose and possess such other qualification (if any) as may be prescribed by the Ordinances.
3. A course in the department shall not be started in an academic session if the number of eligible candidates is less than 10 in the Post Graduate/ Diploma Courses. In case of M.Phil the minimum number of eligible candidates is 10 in M.Phil (SFS) and 05 in M.Phil (Regular). In case the course is not started by the department due to unavailability of minimum number of students for admission the fee deposited by the students shall be refunded.
4. All admissions will be provisional till the applicant completes all the formalities required.
5. Candidates called for admission shall be required to appear at their own expenses before the admission committee of the Department concerned on the dates notified by the University/ Head of the Department for verification of documents.
6. At the time of admission, the applicant must furnish original copies of all documents for verification along with Transfer Certificate or Migration Certificate as the case may be, from the Institution last attended by him/her. However the admission of the Candidate will be considered provisional till all the original documents required for admission are submitted within the stipulated time/date notified by the Head of the Department.
7. The applicant shall give an undertaking that if any of the certificates submitted by him/her is found incorrect, his/her admission shall be cancelled.
8. Admission of Candidates with a Supplementary : An applicant who is declared eligible to appear at the supplementary examination may be provisionally admitted, at his/her own risk, to the next higher class in the beginning of the session by the last day fixed for admission subject to the conditions mentioned in the clause given below. He/she will be assumed to have secured minimum pass marks in the subject of supplementary examination for the purpose of preparation of merit list for admission.
9. A candidate who fails or absents himself at the supplementary examination shall have no right to continue in the next higher class and his/her provisional admission to the next higher class shall stand cancelled automatically. In such cases the Fee shall not be refunded.
10. Admission of in-service candidates: In-service candidates may be allowed admission to the various courses on the production of "No Objection-Cum-Character Certificate" from their employers, without which their applications will not be considered. This Certificate must be produced within the stipulated time period recommended by the concerned Admission Committee of the Department failing which the candidate will be denied admission.



CLARIFICATIONS

1. Acceptance of application form does not guarantee admission. Admissions will be made on the basis of merit subject to the availability of the number of seats for each course and subject to fulfillment of the conditions laid down by the University for the purpose from time to time.
2. A candidate should submit a separate application form for each subject / course. If a candidate is not admitted in a course applied for his application would not be transferred in any other department even if a vacancy exists in that department. A candidate is required to apply separately for each course in time in the prescribed application form.
3. The student who has secured higher percentage of marks without the addition of concessional marks shall rank higher in order of merit than the one who has secured the same percentage of marks with the addition of the concessional marks allowed to him under the rules.
4. Number of students will be restricted to the sanctioned strength prescribed for each course in the university teaching departments. Any change in the number of the seats recommended by the Head of the Department shall be enforced only by the permission of the Vice Chancellor.
5. In the case of one who is a regular student or an ex-student of the department in the previous session and who is otherwise eligible, a bare pass in the last examination is enough for admission to the next higher class provided his/her conduct and character has been satisfactory.
6. A student shall not be admitted as a regular student after graduation for more than three degrees/ diploma/ certificate courses of six years as a regular student.
7. A Candidate can opt for admission into Certificate/ Diploma/ Advance Diploma Courses simultaneously along with the Graduation/ Post-Graduation Courses.
8. All the relevant ordinances at the University shall be applicable in the admission procedure.

ADMISSIONS TO THE FIRST YEAR OR FIRST SEMESTER OF M.A./M.SC./M.COM./M.B.A./DIPLOMA/CERTIFICATE COURSES

1. The merit of a candidate for admission in M.Sc./ M.Com. course shall be calculated by adding the marks obtained by him/her at the qualifying examination (Bachelor's degree) to the marks obtained by him/her during the three/four years examination in the subject concerned in which he/she seeks admission to his/her Post Graduation course in case when candidate has studied the concerned subject at the graduation level. This grand total will be converted into percentage taking into account the grand total of the maximum marks of the qualifying examination and the maximum marks of the three/four years of examinations in the subject concerned. In a case when candidate has not studied the concerned subject at graduate level in which candidate seeks admission to his/her post graduation course then the percentage of total aggregate marks obtained by the candidate at the qualifying examination shall be used for making the merit list. The merit of the candidates seeking admission in the undergraduate courses will be determined on the basis of marks obtained at the qualifying examination.
2. The merit list of subject and non-subject candidates for admission to a Post Graduate course in the faculties of Social Sciences shall be prepared separately on the basis of aggregate marks at the degree level. Not more than 20 percent of the total seats shall be filled in from the non subject candidates. However, left over subject seats if any, could be filled in by the non-subject candidates.
3. The procedure of admission in MBA will be governed by the guidelines of the government of Rajasthan.
4. For Diploma/Certificate courses the preparation of merit list will be done as per the norms of the concerned Department as approved by the University



5. If the candidate has grades mentioned in the mark-sheet of any university/institution, the conversion to marks will be done as per the information provided in the mark-sheet or by the university/institution concerned.
6. Whenever two or more candidates obtain equal percentage of marks in merit, the percentage of marks obtained at graduate level by such candidates shall be taken into account for deciding the merit. If candidates are still having the same percentage of marks then the Senior Secondary marks shall be taken into account and if candidates are still having the same percentage of marks then the marks obtained in the Secondary examination will be taken into account to decide the merit.
7. The merit list shall take into account the concessions or relaxations if any, as applicable for NCC, NSS and other co-curricular activity.
8. On the date notified at the back of the front cover page of Prospectus, a merit list of the eligible candidates in all the categories for the course concerned shall be displayed on the Notice Board of the respective department along with the date of personal interview and document verification.
9. All candidates whose names appear in the merit list and subsequently in the merit of admissions after counseling shall have to deposit the fee through a bank draft in the name of the **Registrar, MDS University Ajmer** as per the fee schedule given for each course in the Prospectus. Candidate in person has to ensure his/her presence between 10.30 am to 2.00 pm with original documents supporting qualification, reservation and concession, if any and the bank draft of the fee on the date of personal interview and document verification. Fee in any other form shall not be accepted. On the failure to deposit the fee and original transfer certificate by the notified date, the claim of the candidate for admission shall be forfeited.
10. Physical presence of a candidate shall be considered only on the submission of original mark sheet of the qualifying examination along with the bank draft of fee, failing which he/she shall be considered unwilling to seek admission. However on the recommendation of admission committee the candidate may submit the Transfer Certificate after the date of counseling but within the time period given by the admission committee. If the candidate fails in depositing the Transfer Certificate within the time limit so specified, his/her claim will stand forfeited and fee so deposited will not be refunded in any case.
11. If a candidate has applied for admission to more than one course and is admitted to one of them, subsequent to which his/her name appears in the merit list of another course showing entitlement to admission then he/she will have the option to choose either of the course subject to the adjustment of the fee. However, such interdepartmental transfer between the courses within the university teaching departments shall be allowed only up to 4.00 pm of the following (working) day of the personal interview/document verification, so as to allow quick finalization of the admissions.
12. Subsequent merit lists shall be displayed on the notice board of respective departments if seats remain vacant however candidates once called shall not be called again. When all the candidates who have applied for admission have been called for counseling and even then the seats remain vacant, the admission committee of the concerned department may give chance to those candidates who did not turn up in the counseling earlier. This chance shall be given in order of merit. The concerned department will display the list of such candidates on the Notice Board, who did not turn up in the previous counseling. If the seats still remain vacant the admission committee may seek permission from the Vice Chancellor to invite fresh applications and complete the admissions following the procedures stated above. The admission of candidates already admitted in the department will not be affected even if the university/department decides to invite fresh applications to fill the vacant seats.

ADMISSIONS IN THE SUBSEQUENT YEARS (ANNUAL SCHEME AND SEMESTERS)

1. In the courses under annual scheme, students who have passed in the previous year will also have to fill up the form as per the Prospectus after declaration of the results along with the requisite fee before the date notified by the Head of the Department.
2. In the Semester based courses, if the result of the previous semester is awaited by the date of commencement of the session then the students shall be promoted to the next semester on the basis of an undertaking on a plain paper as per the format below:

3. The dates for the submission of undertaking shall be as below: Distribution of format of Undertaking Semester III Monday July 4, 2016 Semester II & IV Monday January 2, 2017. Submission of the undertaking of Semester III is due on Monday July 11, 2016 and for Semester II & IV on Friday, January 13, 2017.
4. For the II year and III/V Semester, the student will have to fill up the form as per the Prospectus and deposit the prescribed fee for the complete one academic session after having passed the previous semester, else the admission shall stand cancelled.
5. The fee deposited as per point 1 or 4 shall not be refunded.
6. An applicant who is declared eligible to appear at the supplementary examination, may be provisionally admitted, at his/her own risk, to the next higher class in the beginning of the session by the last date fixed for admission subject to the conditions mentioned in the clause given below. He/she will be assumed to have secured minimum passing marks in the subject of supplementary examination for the purpose of preparation of merit list for admission.
7. A candidate who fails or does not appear at the supplementary examination shall have no right to continue in the next higher class and his/her provisional admission to the next higher class shall stand cancelled automatically. In such cases the fee shall not be refunded.





RESERVATIONS

Reservation of Seats/ Relaxation of Marks for SC, ST OBC, SBC, Physically Handicapped, Transgender, Displaced Kashmiri Candidates and University Employee, employee's spouse/son or daughter.

- a) Total 50 percent of seats in each course in the Faculties of Social Science, Science, Commerce, Law, Management (including Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved for natural born sons/daughters of parents belonging to Scheduled Castes (16 percent), Scheduled Tribes (12 percent), Other Backward Classes (21 percent excluding those who fall within category of creamy layer) and special backward class (5%). (See notification dated 29.6.10 No. Acad. II /MDSU/ 2010/ 20571) on producing the required Certificates.
- b) Three percent of the total number of seats in each course in the faculties specified in (a) above will be reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates (enclose certificate as per note ii) and one percent for displaced Kashmiri candidates in all the categories.
- c) Super numeral seats in each course run by the university teaching departments shall be reserved for the University Employees (teacher, officer and non teaching staff), employee's spouse/son or daughter. These additional seats will be in addition to the total number of seats allotted in that particular course. The admission under this reserved category will be made on the basis of merit of applicants under this category. One additional seat will be reserved for the University wards having 20 seats per course. In case of 40 seats, 2 seats will be reserved for the University employees/wards. This reservation would also be applicable for admission to those courses where university entrance examination is conducted. However, the reservation would not be applicable for admission to those courses where state level entrance test examination is conducted. In case of equal marks obtained by two or more candidates after calculating the merit, preference will be given to non-income tax payers.
- d) Two super numeral seats shall be created for students from Jammu and Kashmir in all courses.

- d) All Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, OBC, SBC, PH, Transgender and displaced Kashmiri candidates who have passed the qualifying examination for admission to the course(s) in the university shall be arranged in the order of merit among themselves. The certificate of OBC category issued prior to July 1, 2013 will not be considered for the benefit of the particular (OBC) category.
- e) Special relaxation for wards of Kashmiri migrants as per the MHRD Secondary and Higher Education Department GOI letter no. 3-1/2012-NER dated 27.2.2012
 1. Extension in the date of admission by about 30 days.
 2. Relaxation in cut off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
 3. Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course wise.
 4. Reservation of atleast 1 seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
 5. Waiving of domicile requirement.
- f) For SC/ST/OBC/SBC candidates:-
 - i. Those who have secured marks above the level upto which general category students are admitted, should not be counted towards reserved quota at all and should be included in the general merit list of admissions.
 - ii. Excluding those admitted on merit along with General Candidates as at (i) above, other Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, OBC and SBC candidates should be admitted in the order of merit going down the inter-se-merit list to the extent of availability of seats in the particular category.
 - iii. It is clarified that in order to fill the reservation quota, there should be no hesitation to go down, if necessary, to the pass percentage of the qualifying examination (i.e. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Pass Course as well as Honours degree for admission to a Post-Graduation).
 - iv. In case of non-availability of SC candidate(s) the reserve seat(s) for SC shall be filled in by ST candidates, if available. Similarly, in case of non-availability of ST candidate(s), the reserve seat(s) of ST shall be filled in by SC candidates, if available.
 - v. Left over SC/ST/OBC/SBC reserved seats could be filled in by general category of the candidates by concerned Head of Department/ Incharge/ Director in case of non-availability of SC/ST/OBC/SBC candidates after taking permission from Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.
- g. Wards of armed personnel :

3 % seats will be reserved for wards of armed personnel killed in action or of personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service / died while in service with death attributable to military service / disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service or wards of personnel awarded gallantry award or wards of awarded Ex servicemen .

NOTE:

- i. Candidates belonging to above categories will be required to produce a certificate to that effect from a District Magistrate/Tehsildar/Sub-Divisional Magistrate, ACEM without which their cases will not be considered under the above provisions (O-81-II).
- ii. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS & NRI'S

- Admission to foreign students shall be given as per the policies of the Government of India (Ministries of External Affairs, Home and Human Resource Development) declared from time to time.
- The admission of self-supporting students will be confirmed only after having sought clearance from the Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Education), Government of India, New Delhi or High Commission/Embassy concerned.
- The foreign students are required to submit a medical certificate including report of HIV test from the specified authority at the time of their admission.
- Minimum eligibility for admission shall be 60% marks in aggregate at the qualifying examination.
- Incomplete application form will not be entertained.
- Application must accompany a bank draft worth Rs. 1000/- as processing fee in favour of the Registrar, Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer
- A caution money of Rs. 5000/- shall be charged from the self-supporting foreign students if they have been provided with hostel accommodation.
- No direct application / documents of the foreign students who wish to seek admission to P G course/ Ph. D. course will be entertained by the Head of the Teaching Departments/ Supervisors for Ph.D. course. They are required to submit the same to the office of the Dean, Student Welfare of the university to ascertain the eligibility.
- The foreign students are required to maintain good conduct during the course of studies in the University. The Chief Proctor can take disciplinary action in case of defaulters. Fees and other dues must be cleared on time.
- Every International student shall report to Foreign Registration Officer, for extension of his/her visa three months in advance. They shall keep close liaison with foreign Registration Office regarding visa formalities, etc.
- All admissions shall be provisional till all formalities are completed.
- All other Rules for local students will also apply to the International students.
- All inquiries and duly filled in application form for admission should be addressed to the Dean, Student Welfare, Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer.
- 15% supernumerary seats in all courses will be reserved for International Students including Persons of Indian Origin. Out of 15% supernumerary seats 1/3 i.e. 5% seats would be preferably filled by children of NRIs on payment of five times the fee payable by a regular student of the course.
- Familiarization session would be organized for freshly enrolled international students for at least three weeks prior to the commencement of the academic session. This session would provided interaction with authorities and would also include inputs on specific and relevant information about the region, city and suburbs, local customs, culture, language, civil facilities etc.

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

University Fellowships

One University fellowship worth Rs. 6000.00 will be offered to the research students in each faculty at the University campus.

Departmental Fellowships

One fellowships worth Rs. 5000.00 will be offered to the research students in each teaching department of the University.

UG & PG PROGRAMMES

PROFESSIONAL FACULTY FUND FELLOWSHIP

One Scholarship each of rupees 250/- per month for 12 months shall be given to the meritorious students of each batch of M.Phil/Advance Diploma/ PG Diploma/Diploma Courses and one each studying in the previous and final years of M.A./M.Sc./M.Com./MBA or equivalent master degree course. Also to the topper studying in the UG course Part I, Part II and Part III and to the student in the I semester and III semester for those studying in semester scheme.

At the entry level in each course the topper of the entrance examination or if admissions are made on the basis of % of marks at the graduate degree level, then the topper on the basis aggregate of marks in the qualifying examination shall be eligible for scholarship in courses having more than one year duration the toppers of the previous year shall be eligible for the scholarship.

To ensure that the scholarship is earned by a genuine candidate the student who does not fill up/ is not eligible to fill up the examination form shall not be considered eligible for the scholarship.

NEED CUM MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

The objective of the Scheme is to provide financial assistance to the poor and meritorious students to enable them to pursue higher education. These scholarships are available for students studying at the Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University Campus only and will be awarded through the Office of the Dean, Student Welfare.

- These scholarships are available for studies in all UG and PG courses in the M.D.S. University Campus, Ajmer.
- The annual income of the beneficiary/parent or guardian of beneficiary should not exceed Rs. 2.50 lakh from all sources.
- Financial assistance will be given to pursue higher education in the University Campus. The Scholarship amount will be credited to the student's account in the Bank available at the Campus.

CENTERS / CELLS

CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP & SMALL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT (ESBM)

This Center is successfully running in the University Campus. It was established in April, 2004 and is India's first University based Entrepreneurship Development Institute. The Center offers MBA with Dual specialization, MBA Executive Programme and BBA in Entrepreneurship and Family Business Management.

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTER (HRDC)

The UGC-Human Resource Development Center (HRDC) of the University has been established to conduct UGC Sponsored Teacher Training Programmes as Orientation, Refresher courses, Summer and Winter schools and short term courses for College and University Teachers.

COACHING ACADEMY

The University has a special Coaching Academy for NET and for entry in services and remedial coaching under the XIIth Plan Scheme of the UGC. It has modern teaching facilities like computers and multi media projectors and several candidates are presently benefiting from this Remedial Coaching Academy. The Academy was formally inaugurated by the Vice Chairman of the UGC on 15th May 2010.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) instills a momentum of quality and consciousness in Higher Educational Institutions leading to continuous institutional improvement. NAAC advocates the establishment of an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) by every accredited institution as a post accreditation measure. Hence to make quality enhancement an integral part of institutional functioning, the MDS University has also established an IQAC to generate good practices and ideas for planning, implementing and measuring the outcome of its academic and administrative performance.

ALGAE BIOFUEL & BIOMOLECULES CENTRE

An interdisciplinary research centre comprising faculty from Departments of Microbiology, Environmental Science, Food Science & Nutrition, Economics and Centre for Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management with an aim to design and develop a system for the purpose of simultaneous production of biofuel(s) and other biomolecules through mass cultivation of algae at a low cost. It also aims imparting training in these areas.

AISHE CELL

The Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi and the University Grants Commission have initiated All India Survey on Higher Education to prepare reliable and comprehensive databases on Higher Education Statistics since 2010-11. The university has established this cell (The Registrar, as Convener: Dr. Ashwini Tiwari, University Nodal Officer as Coordinator, Deputy Registrar -Academic-II, Dr. Mahesh Chand Soni, Computer Programmer with other members) to coordinate the compilation of statistics of all the Affiliated Colleges as well as of the university campus. DR. B. R. AMBEDKAR SHODH PEETH

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Shodh Peeth was established during Convocation Ceremony on October 6, 2015 when Hon'ble Governor of Rajasthan Shri Kalyan Singh had put forth the need for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Shodh Peeth and the Vice Chancellor Prof Kailash Sodani has immediately announced for the Peeth with funding of Rs. one crore from the Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University Ajmer. It is spacious and capable of providing varieties of services to Teachers, Scholars, Student and Public by regularly organizing Lecture series, Seminars, Conference, Discussion, Exchange of thoughts, Symposia and conducting field based studies for grass root planning.

The **vision** is to ensure social emancipation, economic empowerment, educational excellence and participation of Dalit in Nation Building. The main **motto** of studying the socio-economic status of the SC/ST population in Rajasthan to enlist every major and minor problem needs of the communities and to the other related research studies. It is also intended to perform evaluation study on the ongoing schemes, programmes of the Peeth to see the extent to which they have been successful and reach the deserved class and people, since such studies throw more light deeper than the administrative inspection reports.

PRITHVI RAJ CHAUHAN ETIHASIK EVAM SANSKRITIK SHODH KENDRA

Ajmer has its historical significance since the prehistoric age. During 6th or 7th century B.C. the Chauhan Rajputs occupied the region and founded the Chauhan empire. The great ruler Prithviraj Chauhan the ruler of Ajmer and Delhi also has great significance. Ajaypal was the founder of Ajmer or Ajmer. Due to not only religious or cultural importance of the province but due to the strategic importance of the region Ajmer was remain centre of political and diplomatic activities of various rulers. The Turks, the Mugals, the Marathas and the British occupied Ajmer. Similarly Ajmer changed hands among the rulers of Rajputana and the Marwar and Mewar. In 1956 the Ajmer Merwara state was integrated with the state of Rajasthan.

MDS University, Ajmer established the Shodh Kendra in 1997. The objectives mainly are to study and research the history and culture of Rajasthan particularly. To achieve the objective the Shodh Kendra is expected to work on the following targets-

1. Survey of Rajasthan for its socio-cultural heritage
2. Collect original sources for archiving and preserving them as photocopies at the centre
3. Conduct research to establish facts in the history of Rajasthan.
4. Organize seminars, conferences, workshops and training on historical and cultural history of heritage rich Rajasthan and publish research journal
5. Publish material related to the history of Rajasthan

SINDHU SHODH PEETH

The Sindhu Shodh Peeth (S S P) was established on 21-9-2015 in the Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University campus as a Research Centre. The inception of the S S P was started in the month of February 2015, when the University organized two day National conference on "Sindhi Story-Centenary Celebration, 13-14 Feb. 2015". Thereafter, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India decided to sanction Rs. One crore to promote Sindhi language through National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language.

Thrust Area

The Thrust area of Sindhu Shodh Peeth will be research, teaching, translation and extension activities etc. through Sindhi, English and Hindi languages

Objectives

The objective of Sindhu Shodh Peeth is to provide research facilities for students, academicians, intellectuals to undertake studies and research work on the subjects related to Sindhu Civilization (Mohan-jo-darro & Harrapa), Sindhi language & Literature, Sindhi Art & Culture, Social strata of Sindhi Population and History of Sindhi population.

RESOURCES AND FACILITIES

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library housed in a separate three storied library building named 'Saraswat Bhawan' in an area of 5100 sq. mtr. approx. with immense textual and non-textual reading material in variety of documents concerned with different subjects. In addition to the general & reference books (50000), the collection also covers sufficient journals (172 current+2130 back volumes), reports (1240), conference proceedings, statistics, audio-visual material CDs/ CD Databases. The readers are benefitted with Lending, Reading Room, Reference, Xerox, Back Sets of Journals, Consultation of Theses & Dissertations, Old News Papers, Inter-Library Loan, Select Bibliographical Service and OPAC.

The Central Library is fully computerized since June 2003, with technical and financial assistance of the UGC's INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar; using SOUL 2.0.0.12 software developed by the INFLIBNET Centre with other operating systems and application software; comprising of complete Database of Books, Theses and Periodicals, OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) is available for readers. Details of collections are also accessible at www.inflibnet.ac.in-Union Database/INDCAT.

The University has signed MOU with the INFLIBNET Centre for uploading the synopsis submitted by the research scholars for pursuing Ph.D. Thesis, at the web portal <inlibnet.ac.in>. Synopses submitted at universities in India are available for study at this portal. The research scholars should register themselves at this portal for uploading synopses

UGC EDU-SAT ACCESS

The UGC distance learning programme – the EDU Satellite Programme under UGC-ASC is an interactive series of classes and lectures meticulously planned for different subjects, courses and levels of students. The MDS University has taken the initiative for the successful conduction of this programme for its students and faculty members.

WEB SECTION

Web Sections provides internet facility in the campus of the university using BSNL Leased line on 6 core OFC.

CENTRAL EQUIPMENT FACILITY

For the Researchers in the field of Science, a common platform has been created in the campus for analysis and research work. The Central Equipment Facility has hi-tech equipments for research as Fourier Transformation Infra Red Spectroscop (FTIR), a Gel Documentation System, Polymerase Chain Reactor (PCR) and Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer (AAS). In addition, various departments of science are equipped with High Tech Laboratories with facilities such as Bioacoustic analysis, Microphotographic analysis, Oxitop BOD System, HPLC, CO₂ incubator, Ultrasonicator, Brookfield Viscometer, Gas Chromatographs and Auto Nitrogen analyzer.

SMART CLASSROOMS

The university has smart class rooms consisting of Smart Boards, Panels and Digital Slates for interactive teaching.

The National Service Scheme of the University has three operational units. CONFERENCE HALLS (Swaraj Sabhagar - University's Auditorium)

DISCIPLINE

Every student enrolled in the University should maintain strict discipline and decorum governed under the Ordinances and Statutes of this University. Any act of misconduct committed by a student inside or outside the campus shall be an act of violation of discipline of the University.

Violations of the discipline shall include:

1. Disruption of teaching, student examination, research or administrative work, curricular or extra-curricular activity or residential life of the members of the University, including any attempt to prevent any member of the University or its staff from carrying out his or her work; and any act reasonably likely to cause such disruption.
2. Damaging or defacing University property or the property of members of the University or any other property inside or outside the University campus.
3. Engaging in any attempt at wrongful confinement of teachers, officers, employees and students of the University or camping inside or creating nuisance inside the boundaries of houses of teachers, officers and other members of the University.
4. Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidatory language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
5. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the University Campus/ Constituent Colleges and outside University Campus. Students are advised to go through the 'Anti Ragging' section of the prospectus.
6. Every student residing in the Hostels of this University should strictly obey the above rules as well as rules and regulations of the Hostels
7. Student should maintain discipline in the Campus, on educational tours, On-the-job training, summer training etc.
8. Students are prohibited to indulge in any kind of activity like teasing, ragging, molesting, physical harassment, mental harassment, smoking and drinking alcoholic beverages, etc.
9. Rules of attendance will be applicable as per the directions of Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan.
10. Inside University campus a student must always carry identity card with him/her and shall produce whenever asked for by the authorities, teachers and/or University Security Staff.

Students found involved in any kind of indisciplinary activities will be subjected to punishment from the University Authorities.

RAGGING



UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 and as per the provisions of anti-ragging verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide SLP No (s) 24295 of 2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principals', Colleges, Kerala and Ors (with SLP(C) No.24296-99/2004 and W.P. (CrI) No. 173/2006 and SLP(C) No.14356/2005)

Ragging means the following

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness another student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Punishable ingredients of ragging:

- Abetment to ragging
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- Wrongful restraint
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
- Criminal trespass
- Criminal intimidation
- All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging"
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- Criminal conspiracy to ragging
- Public nuisance created during ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- Use of criminal force
- Extortion
- Offences against property
- Physical or psychological humiliation

Measures for prohibition of ragging at the University level

The University shall strictly observe the provisions of the Act of the Central Government and the State Governments, if any, or if enacted, considering ragging as a cognizable offence under the law on a par with rape and other atrocities against women and ill-treatment of persons belonging to the SC/ST, and prohibiting ragging in all its forms in all institutions.

Ragging in all its forms shall be totally banned in the entire University Campus, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports canteen, etc.) whether located within the campus or outside residential, sports, canteen, etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.

The institution shall take strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.

The application form for admission/ enrolment has a printed undertaking in English to be filled up and signed by the candidate to the effect that he/she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and to the effect that he/she has not been expelled and/or debarred from admission by any institution and that he/she, if found guilty of the offence of ragging and/or abetting ragging, is liable to be punished appropriately.

The application form also contains a printed undertaking, in English to be signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant to the effect that he/she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.

The application for admission shall be accompanied by a document in the form of the School Leaving Certificate/Transfer Certificate/Migration Certificate/Character Certificate which shall include a report on the behavioral pattern of the applicant, so that the institution can thereafter keep intense watch upon a student who has a negative entry in this regard.

A student seeking admission to the hostel shall have to submit additional undertaking in the form of Annexure I (both Parts) along with his/ her application for hostel accommodation.

At the commencement of the academic session the Head of the Institution shall convene and address a meeting of various functionaries/agencies, like Hostel Wardens, representatives of students, parents/guardians, faculty, district administration including police, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the Institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably.

To make the community at large and the students in particular aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging, big posters (preferably multicolored with different colours for the provisions of law, punishments, etc.) shall be prominently displayed on all Notice Boards of all Departments, hostels and other buildings as well as at vulnerable places. Some of such posters shall be of permanent nature in certain vulnerable places.

Whom to contact in case of need

The students/ freshers can contact the Dean Students' Welfare, Chief Proctor and University teachers whom they can turn to for help and guidance for various purposes (including Wardens, Head of the institution/ Registrar and relevant district and police authorities)

Measures for encouraging healthy interaction between freshers and seniors

The institution shall set up appropriate committees including the course in charge, student advisor, Warden and some senior students to actively monitor, promote and regulate healthy interaction between the freshers and senior students.

Freshers' welcome parties shall be organized in each department by the senior students and the faculty together soon after admissions, preferably within the first two weeks of the beginning of the academic session, for proper introduction to one another and where the talents of the freshers are brought out properly in the presence of the faculty, thus helping them to shed their inferiority complex, if any, and remove their inhibitions.

Punishments

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the University, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the University level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of admission
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 1 lakh
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the University shall resort to collective punishment.

Note :

Student and his/her parent/Guardian is also required to go through the relevant UGC regulation on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions. Student are required to sign an affidavit and submit the same with the application form.
