EU policy context



Europe experience:

- Exchanges of students contribute to the development of well-qualified, open-minded and internationally experienced people able to cope with the challenges of knowldege based society and global economy
- Partnerships between universities become a basis for structured cooperation, strengthen universities international capacities and facilitate exchange of knowhow and innovation.





EU policy context



Recent policy developments in the field of HE:

- Establishment of a common framework to promote citizen's mobility and employability (the EHEA)
- Process for a greater compatibility and comparability of HE systems (The 'Bologna process'): system based on 2 main cycles with the aim to promote students/academic staff mobility, improve recognition of diplomas and promote European cooperation in quality assurance



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EU external cooperation



Objectives

- To enhance in the medium term the political, cultural educational and economic links between the EU and other countries in the world
- European HE to be exposed to other educational approaches and standards in the world so as to result in innovation and the identification of best practices



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EU external cooperation instruments



To achieve these goals, the EU external cooperation supports a range of **high profile cooperation** and **exchange programmes**:

- Erasmus Mundus (EM)
- Eramus Mundus External Cooperation Window (EM ECW)

Programme complementary to EM





EU external cooperation

- EMECW a possibility to send and receive students and staff all over the World
- In 2006 the European Commission launched the Erasmus Mundus External Cooperation Window (EMECW).
- Structured co-operation between EU HEI and HEI in specific geographical regions on variety of subjects/disciplines of common interest
- The overall aim with the program is to further deepen and enhance the higher education cooperation links between EU and the rest of the world.

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EU external cooperation (cont.)



- EMECW is a mobility program targeting undergraduate, master, doctorate and post doctorate students.
- It also targets to reinforce the capacities of the academic staff by offering teaching, training and research periods abroad.
- Special attention paid to socio-economically disadvantaged groups and populations in a vulnerable situation



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EU external cooperation (cont.)



Offered scholarships cover travel (approx. 2500 Euro depending on country), insurance (75 Euro/month), cost of living (1000-2500 Euro/month), and for master and doctorate students a limited amount (3000 Euro) for research/fees.

The length of the scholarships varies between 1 & 34 months. For further details see e.g.

Management of the Partnerships



Financial Management

- Lump sum for organisation of the Mobility (Flat rate of 10.000€ per eligible participating institution)
- Unit costs to cover the implementation of the Mobility
 - ? Travel costs (in accordance with distance: from 250-2,500 €)
 - ? Monthly allowance (from 1,000 to 2,500 €)
 - ? Tuition fees (from « fee waiver » to 5,000 € / a.y.)
 - ? Insurance costs (75 € / month abroad)



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Organisation of the mobility



Visibility & communication strategy

- •Wide Publication and solid Visibility on the opportunities available in the partner institutions (Group I) and non partner ones (Group II and III)
- Networking strategy

Guarantee a transparent selection

- Objective and academic merit
- Equal opportunities (gender-balance, disabled or economically disadvantaged candidate)

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- Avoid brain-drain
- Protection of Personal Data



Key elements for the success of the partnership project

 Institutional cooperation between the higher education institutions

- Academic cooperation to promote the mutual recognition of qualifications and diplomas
- Services for students and academic staff

Provision of services to the new comers

- International relations office
- Assistance for obtaining visa
- Welcoming and hosting students& scholars
- Housing facilities
- Coaching and Counselling
- Welfare Services
- Languages Courses
- Social Integration





Brain drain



- The EMECW aims at raising capacities and increase knowledge rather than favour the brain-drain from third-countries
- How personal needs, career development and avoiding brain-drain can be combined in order to favour the return of the individuals to contribute actively to raise capacities in 3rd countries?

23/03–01/04: Steering Committee meeting. Selection report.

02/04–01/09: Preparations and mobility of undergraduates and masters.



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Selection Criteria



- Candidate's choice
- Receiving/host university's priority list
- Ranking based on academic merits
- Even distribution among partners
- Distribution of candidates among the priority fields or the thematic expertise of individual partner institutions
- Gender balance (50-50% if possible)





Selection - admission



Undergraduates

- To be dealt with as "ordinary" exchange students
- The course must be specified
- LoA to be written by the coordiating unit



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Selection - admission



Masters

- Admission for the entire course; applications to the exam unit. Eligible for degree, language test required
- Lol to be written by the coordinating unit
- Formal admission by the program
- Admission for part of a course; to be handled as exchange student



Application
 (personal data & applied scholarships)

Uploading of required documents

It can receive up to 100 000 applications

And serve 1000 users per day

EM ECW future opportunities



- For the a. y. 2009/2010, the programme will be allocated an increased budget of 163 M € (19M for India Window)
- There will be a geographical window for Asia and a specific window for India allowing the participation of Asian (incl. Indian) HE institutions and the mobility of about 960 students/scholars (330 Asian – 630 Indian)
- The next call for proposals is expected to be published by December 2008. Deadline March 2008
