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
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# From the Director's Desk...



**TILSS**. Tuljapur, which lies in the Osmanabad district of Maharashtra, sprawls over a 100 acre campus situated on a vast plateau, overlooking the ancient temple town. The institute was set up with support from the Government of Maharashtra in 1986 and currently boasts of Masters Courses in Rural Development and three new courses that have been introduced this year: 'Sustainable Livelihoods and Natural Resource Governance', 'Development Policy Planning and Practice' and 'Social Innovations and Entrepreneurship'.

All the courses have been structured to address the issues emerging from a developing economy like ours. The preservation, conservation and eventual amalgamation of traditional practices into modern development regimes, thus promoting sustainability through knowledge is what these courses aim at. The campus also offers a Five Year Integrated Masters Programme since 2012 and WASH, a post graduate diploma course in Water, Sanitation and Hygiene.

In 1988, during the first phase of building the campus, community projects were initiated and linkages built with rural communities, in order to work towards contributing towards transformation of the rural economy, creating conditions of sustainable rural development that takes into account factors like human dignity, equity, inclusion and harmony with the environment.

Students in our campus have not only been exposed to various courses that help them gain in knowledge from the local to the global level but they also learn by living in a very rural setting, cut off from all the hustle-bustle of mainstream urban life. T.I.S.S. thus aims at creating development experts, social entrepreneurs and livelihood professionals in the garb of researchers and activists who can successfully reach out to the marginalized sections of society at local, regional, national as well as international levels.

Additionally, a month long fieldwork in each semester, with government and non-government organizations is an integral part of the courses. Thus, a four dimensional programme of learning through teaching, field action, research and documentation moulds students into dedicated, well trained agents of change for a better and more sustainable future.

# Social Work in Rural Development

### About the course:

The Masters in Social Work Course specializing in Rural Development (RD) is a course designed to provide a panoramic view of the existing rural situation. Based off the Rural Campus of Tata Institute of Social Sciences in Tuljapur (Marathwada region of Maharashtra)—one of the most backward regions of the country, it enables the students to get a panoptic perspective of the issues that are faced by the backward, underprivileged and marginalized sections of Rural India. The rigorous course curriculum covers topics ranging from Social Work, NGO Management, Microfinance, Sustainable livelihood models, Farm – Non Farm linkage to Economics, History of India's Development, Development Models, Governance and Social Justice.

The course is spread over two years and split into four semesters. Each student is assessed on multiple criteria during each semester that includes the final semester exam, case work, presentations of different social issues, assignments, analysis of public policies, review of academic publications and field work. During the second year each student is required to work on a topic of her/his interest and attempt a research study on the same. During the fourth semester, the students spend time in their field of study and carry out a detailed enquiry into the issue they choose to pursue and then come out with their findings in the form of a thesis.

### Field Work:

The field work is a very integral and the most unique component of this course. Each semester has a month long field work with specific objectives and thus through it aims at familiarizing the students with the intricacies of Social Work in Rural India.

The First Field work, which is in the first semester orients the students with the rural experiences, students are placed in extremely backward villages and are required to carry out PRA activities, study the village dynamics. During the second field work the students are placed with NGO's working at the grass root levels and work parallel with the NGO and identify issues with the major focus being advocacy of the issues. In the third field work the students are expected to work with the Government institution and analyze the execution of schemes and understand the planning for district development.

The three field works put together provide the students a broad at the same time an in depth picture of the functioning of the different development agencies and thus empowering them to think critically and work towards inclusive growth and development.

# Development Policy, Planning and Practice

### About the course:

Development in its true sense is both multidimensional and multi-faceted, which deals with the economic growth of a country, and focuses to ensure the well-being of its masses. In due course, certain development trajectories have yielded in growing inequality in society, accompanied by rising mass poverty, livelihood insecurity, social discontent and economic stagnation. As a result, the discourse of development is under vigorous debate, as was never before, owing to the new and dynamic challenges faced by it every day. This requires our utmost academic concentration and critical comprehensive analysis.

MA/MSc in Development Policy, Planning and Practice (DPPP) is designed to address the need of understanding the intricacies and processes of policy making, multilevel planning and implementation. It essentially seeks to contextualise the global scenario, with both the rural and urban grass-root condition of India. With the advent of globalisation, the boundary between the rural and urban worlds is rapidly eroding. This calls for making an efficient intervention through an analytical approach to study these spheres not in isolation, but rather in unison through exploring the linkages. This needs a higher level of theoretical understanding grounded upon real life field experiences and application.

The course is aimed to develop this praxis through an interdisciplinary approach towards a holistic study of the contemporary socio-economic phenomenon in India, followed by efficient policy intervention. This programme is vowed to create a cadre of development professionals encompassing policy analysts, researchers, planners, and practitioners equipped with all skills necessary for policy formulation, planning measures, framing of schemes, monitoring and evaluation.

### Fieldwork Component of the Course:

Reflective learning is facilitated through three compulsory field works, spread over a duration of onemonth each. First field work is designed to understand the dynamics of rural economy and mapping of vulnerabilities. Second field work is devised to study urban poverty. Third field work is a choice based exposure to ground-realities and plausible policy interventions in either urban or rural settings.

During the field works, students work with both rural and urban grass-root level organizations in the thematic areas of livelihood, education, people's rights, displacement, poverty, and alternative sustainable development practice. The field work also gives the students a chance to be associated with higher level think tank institutes dissecting and giving vigorous policy discourses. In this regard, DPPP provides a unique platform for India's socio-economic dynamics to be empathized and voiced.

### About the course:

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With the institute's aim of evolving as the domain of livelihoods and natural resources, in year 2014, along with two other new courses, M.A/M.Sc. programme of Sustainable Livelihoods and Natural Resource Governance (SLNG) was introduced.

In today's changing discourse of development, it is essential to address the questions of sustainability and governance. Be it livelihoods or natural resources—acute sensitivity and thorough knowledge is what is disseminated through the design of the course. Herein, praxis becomes the consistent underlining theme. While the course charts the fundamentals of livelihoods and natural resources in accordance to the current scenario, it leaves ample scope for the students to explore further and draw their independent conclusions based on their learning. As the emerging issues of deprivation become increasingly pressing, a cadre of skilled livelihood professionals would be at the threshold of engaging in just and equitable development of the society.

Over a span of two years and four semesters, the amalgamation of courses in this programme focuses on interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approaches that include understanding the society, ecology, environment, vulnerability, economy, democracy and polity, governance and policy. The students are also required to undertake a research study to present it in the form of a dissertation, on a topic of their choice which forms an integral part of the course in the final semester.

### Fieldwork: what makes it unique!

The fieldwork carried out by the students is one of their unique selling points. Through the extensive fieldwork programme, the students are provided with the opportunity of learning by doing and thus hands on experience working with NGOs, civil society organizations and Government agencies. The practical knowledge thus gained is irreplaceable and makes the student a well moulded professional who is equipped to handle even complicated projects.

The first semester has the students placed in villages with organisations such as Yuva Mitra, Pani Panchayat, Malabar Nature Conservation Society, Shramik Janta Vikas Sanstha, where they get the opportunity to learn sustainable livelihood practices and community rights over natural resources in villages, communities and specific groups.

In the second semester, the students work with prestigious civil society organizations like BAIF (Bhartiya Agro Industrial Foundation), ARTI (Appropriate Rural Technology Institute), Chaitanya, Anthra, which provides them with the opportunity to learn corporate sector livelihood initiatives and community based practices for natural resource governance.

The final fieldwork intends to involve students to be associated with Government's Ministries, Departments and the various Missions. Thus, it helps the students gain practical skills in the planning and implementation of projects, their management, evaluation and documentation process, along with sustainable use of the appropriate technology.

### About the course:

Masters in Social Innovations and entrepreneurship is a specialized Master's programme which aims at training students to explore various sectors so as to focus on one segment which they want to specialize in. The course is a blend of social innovations with entrepreneurial spirit and managerial skills. The larger goal is to develop scholars to look complex social problems with innovative solutions with entrepreneurial zeal, and create sustainable development.

The course is spread across four semesters offering a fine blend of knowledge and skill base. The foundation courses in the first semester coupled with a month long field work adds to the understanding of people and the community base. Following this, in the second semester there is an array of development and planning courses for management of an enterprise. In the third semester, there is a full semester field immersion where one can develop his own pilot venture or work with the existing social enterprises or Corporate Social Responsibility to add to their existing knowledge of the society. The fourth and final semester looks at financial management and understanding along with a focused dissertation topic.

Course Objectives:

- To develop understanding about the need of innovative approaches and use of social entrepreneurship to address complex social issues especially in rural India.
- To study the role of existing social entrepreneurs learning the use of business skills and challenges faced by them.
- To develop analytical and professional competencies among the students for sustainable development with an understanding of management and society.

### Field Work:

Field work is the USP of the courses TISS Tuljapur. The field work for Master's in social innovation and Entrepreneurship has two parts. The first one comprises of a village visit spread over two weeks along with an in-depth analysis of rural livelihood means. In this process not only do the students become sensitive of their surroundings, but they also understand the daily hardships faced my thousands of people in the rural India.

The second part of the field work consists of visits to various Social Enterprises have successfully turned the problems into opportunities and created successful livelihood means for the underprivileged. Organizations like Mann Deshi Mahila Bank, Lijjat Papad, Ambika Masale, BAIF include some of the examples, where the students are placed.

In all, the course aims at developing innovative and entrepreneurial qualities among individuals providing them with the theoretical bases and analytical tools to choose a need based venture, making them the agents of change in the society.

# Student's initiatives

Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Tuljapur, students come from diverse pan-Indian backgrounds representing every nook and corner of the country. Cultural knowledge and such a diverse background thus help them to discuss and understand about important social issues from different perspectives.

**Samvaad** is an open social dialogue that is organized on a monthly basis. Students and faculty members come up with a recent debatable topic, thus facilitating a healthy discussion. Samvaad offers profound and ever-lasting benefits for students and also for the institution. With its emphasis on critical and effective communication, it enables individuals to be well informed about national and international affairs.

**Ambedkar Memorial Lecture** has evolved as a process with its four fundamental objectives. It aims to integrate students from various parts of India to their common areas of interest keeping in mind Ambedkar's thoughts. Second is to promote cultural interaction which would last for life. Third is to propagate different objectives and dimensions of Ambedkar's philosophies and ideologies. The final objective is to formulate the process of continuous socialization amongst everybody, irrespective of cast, creed or gender. AML is a critical and constant engagement for students in the construction and deconstruction of the established notion of our society.

**Prayas** is another student's initiative that aims to provide free of cost academic coaching to t. coaching the children of the most important part of the TISS family- Kakas and Maushis (non-teaching staff). Coaching is provided for entrance exams to various schools and colleges. We also



hope to present the staff members of TISS with an opportunity to complete to complete their education at least up to their higher secondary level.

**Samadhan** is best captured in its name, which is a Hindi word that translates into 'Solution' to a problem. And it is this simple one word philosophy to identify problems and issues plaguing in rural India, then creating a local youth as a local leader (Gramdoot) to find a solution to the same and finally to empower that leader through training and skill development to tackle the problem and implement the solution. It is a concept that seeks to unite the urban and the rural in order to solve rural social issues.





Samadhan combines

two important concepts, that of solutions for rural problem and that of the role of youth in finding and implementing these solutions. The potential role of the Rural Youth in this process is extensive. Majority of the country's population lives in



rural areas. Samadhan aims at providing a platform to the Rural Youth to come with innovative solutions to solve their area's problems. There is a two pronged objective of firstly, finding solutions for problems of Rural



India, and secondly, to develop India's Rural Youth into leaders.

Mushaira is а poetic symposium. It is an event called as Mehfil, where poets gather to perform their works. Traditionally, Mushaira used to provide a platform to bring poetic expression from different regional and cultural settings. It aims to end the cultural specificity leading to a mass consciousness about the poetry that the free self expression should not stop due to any linguistic barrier.

### National Rural Youth Fest:

An annual affair of the campus, organised entirely by the students itself, NRYF is the event that is eagerly awaited for. It aims at generating and sustaining a platform for exploring, exchanging, reflecting and introspecting ideas on various social sciences fields across a wide range of actors including the youth from the village communities. The festival took its roots in 2008-09 after which it has been garnering constant reputation. Students from across the country and outside, hailing from varied backgrounds have been participating in the festival thus making it a gala event.

Over the duration of three days, the festival establishes a dialogue between the youth, academicians and rural development agencies across the nation with the prime aim of mapping ideas and stimulating debates on social issues. The festival also sustains and reinforces the spirit of volunteerism amongst the youth, so as to ensure a people centered development practice in rural areas. Therefore, NRYF is not just any other campus festival but also something which highlights the multi-dimensional facets of cultural heritage and promotes the participation of youth in various activities.

### Skip-a-Meal:

Initiated by the students of TISS Tuljapur, this unique activity revolves around the concept of providing healthy food to those who do not have access to it. Those volunteering for the initiative skip their one time meal on an assigned day which further is distributed to the children residing in the orphanages.

### Kritagyata:

A student's initiative from the year 2014, it's a day dedicated to the kakas and maushis (non-teaching staff) of the campus, as a gesture of gratitude. It symbolises as a day to recognise and appreciate the nitty-gritties of their work round the clock. When the dominant worldview devalorises labour, the day stands out as an exception. As a part of the celebration, students are delegated the work of kakas and maushis—be it in the hostels, the dining hall, all the other buildings and the rest of the campus. The day is concluded with cultural activities wherein, the kakas and maushis are the guests of honour.





### **Cultural Segment:**



In TISS Tuljapur, students embrace their talents through various cultural platforms—that of music, dance, drama, cinema, poetry and photography. The students' involvement with the activities grooms them further for the growth and development of their overall personality. For instance, 'Ek Awaaz', the drama society delivers performances which both thought-provoking are questions the social and arrangements.

### **About Strive**

'STRIVE' the acronym represents 'Students Re-imagining Versatile Enterprises', an initiate formed collaboratively by the students of the Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship (SIE) course (2015 – 2017) at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Tuljapur. This initiative has been created with the view of supporting and adding practical entrepreneurial knowledge to classroom learning. All eighteen students of the SIE Masters program (2015 – 2017) look forward to learning through entrepreneurial activities on and off campus throughout the academic year and have been motivated and encouraged by Professor Sri Krishna Sudheer and Professor Anjali Kulkarni.

**The Mission :** 'STRIVE' as an organization aims to foster innovation and entrepreneurship on the Tuljapur Campus and beyond and reassure students about the entrepreneurship phenomenon by instilling confidence. By hosting by-weekly events on the campus, students look to sell products that will add value to student life and cater to student needs. By the end of the first academic year, STRIVE hopes to accumulate a sum of money and resources which will eventually be used as a fund to support activities of the SIE course. STRIVE will continue to expand in following academic years, providing a new shape & importance to entrepreneurship on the Tuljapur Campus. Future students of Social Innovation & Entrepreneurship will have a platform to build from and continue to enhance the level of activities performed through STRIVE.

**Funding and Logistics :** Students of MA in Social Innovation & Entrepreneurship (2015 – 2017) have agreed to invest equally in STRIVE, to initiate and test activities and the potential. Like entrepreneurs, they find the importance of investing towards this initiative and thereby securing a sense of responsibility to the activities. The students hope for equal participation from all members, for both, finances and logistical support to make STRIVE a reality. The budget for the first STRIVE event is estimated to be approximately Rs. 13,000.

The **First STRIVE** event has been scheduled for the 11th of August, 2015. The members of the initiative have designed t-shirts for sale on campus. These t-shirts will be sold at a cost of approximately Rs. 300 each. Designs and materials have been decided based on students' interests. Sanish Kulkarni, member of STRIVE, has offered to print these t-shirts through his own venture which he set up as an small entrepreneurial initiative, before joining TISS, Tuljapur. Along with the sale of t-shirts, there will be snacks available for purchase. Members have started discussion on the second STRIVE which is due to be held on the 25th of August, 2015.

### **Future activities**

The students of the SIE Masters program have field visits every Saturday during the semester. They are considering making purchases of handicrafts produced in different villages and for the purpose of sale on campus during the month of September before other students depart for their own field visits. This activity will simultaneously encourage local artisans and bring awareness of their products to the student population.

STRIVE will also include individual venture initiatives by students of the SIE Masters program. For example, Asaram Hatagale, Ravi Sakhare, Sanish Kulkarni and Vineet Singh are planning to develop an agricultural conclave of farmers to help them with market needs. Syed Fazil Sharique is working towards a venture related to Venture Capitalist funding, which will also be supported by STRIVE as required.



















# **TISS Field Action Project**

**TISS** has always progressed and evolved through its continuous action programmes and TISS in planning, policy and program formulation, fostering critical thinking and thus development of people-centered interventions.

The Special Cell for Women and Children, a field action project of TISS, which works towards empowering the survivors of domestic violence, is being taken over by the government of Maharashtra to be replicated in police stations across and even beyond Maharashtra. On the request of the Mumbai high court, in 2005, this campus undertook a research and study of farmer suicides in Maharashtra.


TISS is providing support to the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council in participatory and sustainable development planning and implementation over a five year period from 2005-2009.
