



Trainees in our program spend the majority of their time in St. Joseph's Health Centre, where our 42 bed level II and III newborn units are located. Together with our Obstetrics colleagues, we provide antenatal and newborn care to a population of 1.4

With over 3,700 births per year in our center, approximately 825 newborns require admission to NICU. About 10% of our admissions are transported from referring hospitals.
