## The Scholarships

Sponsored by Xerox Canada Ltd., two (2) scholarships of \$5,000.00 each are offered to students enrolled in a course of study leading to a master's degree in Business Administration. In addition, scholarship recipients will be offered an opportunity for one four-month internship employment during their period of study.

The objective of the scholarships, associated internships and mentoring programs is to encourage high performing diverse men and women to complete their studies, gain skills and work experience that can provide a platform from which to launch their careers.

## Scholarship Categories

The NMBBAA, Xerox Canada Ltd. Scholarship (the "Scholarship") will be awarded as follows:

A one-time, non-renewable, Graduate Scholarship of \$5,000 to a visible minority MBA Candidate enrolled in the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year of their MBA Program, a paid internship at Xerox Canada Ltd., mentorship by a NMBBAA member, and a one-year NMBBAA student membership.



## Scholarship Categories

Scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate high academic achievement, leadership skills and a commitment to helping in the community.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

### Eligibility Criteria

- Students from a self-identified visible minority group who are eligible to work in Canada
- Students enrolled in a full time business degree (graduate) program at a Canadian university for the academic year commencing in the year in which the scholarship application is submitted. Students commencing their studies in the Fall are eligible
- Awardees must be available to complete a four-month internship during a mutually agreed term following the award and prior to the completion of their studies

### Selection Criteria

- High academic achievement
- Recognized contribution to the community
- Demonstrated leadership skills

### Application Requirements

- A completed application form (photocopied forms are acceptable). Completion of Part I and the eight questions in Part II of the application
- Two passport size photos once the Scholarship has been awarded—head shots (once submitted, these photos will be the property of the NMBBAA Scholarship Fund)
