1. FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES OF THE INSTITUTE

The Institute:

- § acts as a Regional Resource Centre of NCERT for the Western Region of the country and serves as an Advanced Centre for conducting research, training and development programmes in school education and teacher education;
- § offers graduate and integrated courses to prepare quality teachers at secondary level in physical sciences, biological sciences, mathematics, social sciences and languages and also offers Post-graduate course to prepare elementary teacher educators;
- § prepares Counsellors for career guidance through a Post-graduate Diploma course (PGDGC);
- § tries out innovative experiments in school education in Demonstration Multipurpose School (DMS);
- **§** undertakes pilot studies and research projects on all aspects of school education;
- § organizes in-service programmes for teachers, teacher educators, supervisors and administrators concerned with school education;
- § interacts dynamically with state departments of education for raising the standard of school education in the region;
- **§** develops and disseminates instructional materials to all concerned;
- **§** tries out innovative pre-service courses in the field of school education;
- § documents and provides information related to various aspects of school education to state level agencies of the region;
- § acts as support system to the states of the region for capacity building of the state/district/sub-district level, teacher education institutions like SCERTs/DIETs/CTEs/IASEs/Block Education Centers in the areas of research, training, development and extension;
- § advises state departments of education on policies and programmes related to various aspects of school education;
- § acts as a monitoring and co-ordination agency for effective implementation of centrally

sponsored schemes from time to time in the field of School Education and Teacher Education.

PROGRAMMES OF THE INSTITUTE

The Institute is actively engaged in teaching, research, training, development, extension, dissemination, monitoring and evaluation through its variety of pre-service and in-service programmes.

- § Developing modalities/tools for continuous and comprehensive evaluation/School Based Evaluation.
- § Developing remedial instructional materials, remedial self-learning sheets, guidelines for group learning in different subject areas at different levels of school education.
- **§** Developing resource materials for all the stages of school education.
- § Developing skill-based training, designing training packages/training models for the DIETs and Teacher Education Institutions.
- **§** Developing diagnostic tools for assessment of learning gaps, learning disabilities and training needs of teachers.
- § Developing teaching strategies/ training packages for the disabled at the school level.

- § Conducting innovative pre-service programmes like one year M.Ed.(Elementary Education), Two Year B. Ed (Secondary), Four Year Integrated B. Sc. B. Ed. and PGDGC.
