Introduction:

DurgabaiDeshmukh College of Special Education (Visual Impairment) was established in 2006 to conduct Bachelors Degree programme in Special Education for the Visually Impaired under the Faculty of Education, University of Delhi and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. The college has been included in the list of colleges prepared under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the University Grant Commission (UGC) Act, 1956.

The college is established and run by the Blind Relief Association, Delhi, a premier non-governmental organization, conducting training programmes to prepare special teachers for the visually challenged for more than 4 decades. The Training Centre for the Teachers of the Visually Handicapped (TCTVH) being run by BRA was established in 1967 under the aegis of National Institute for the Visually Handicapped (NIVH), the then National Centre for the Blind. NIVH continues to extend financial support to run the B.Ed (Special Education-VI) course for preparing qualified and high-quality educators for the visually impaired.

Ideal Location

Named after the famous freedom fighter, educationist and a doyen among social reformers Dr. Durgabai Deshmukh, the College can rightly boast of a proud heritage. The college campus is situated in a very prominent location in the heart of New Delhi, adjacent to the Oberoi Hotel and Delhi Golf Club. In close vicinity are several famous educational institutions like Delhi Public School, Sardar Patel Vidyalaya, BalBharati Public School and Dayal Singh College, to name just a few. Also, in its neighborhood are such places of historical importance as Humaun's Tomb and the Dargah of Hazrat Nizamuddin Aulia. Not only that, capital's most prominent centres of cultural and intellectual activities, namely, India International Centre and India Habitat Centre are also situated close by.

An Excellent Environment for the Teachers in Making.

Housed within the same campus is the reputed JPM Senior Secondary School for the Blind, a government-aided residential school affiliated to C.B.S.E. with over 200 visually challenged students on its roll. This School serves as practicing school for the teacher trainees. Apart from the School, BRA campus has a big Technical Training Centre where a host of programmes in vocational training, including light engineering, book-binding and stationary making, relaxation massage, computer training, call centre training etc. are being conducted for the benefit of the visually challenged. The college also extends the facility of audio recording and Braille printing of study materials to the visually impaired students as per their requirement through the in-house recording studio and Braille Printing Unit. Moreover, BRA regularly hosts national-level sports training and competitive events for the blind. The Government of India has also recognised the pioneering work of The Blind Relief Association and in 2012 conferred the most prestigious Natiotional award for the Best Institute working for the Persons with Disabilities.

Thus, studying in DurgabaiDeshmukh College can give a teacher in the making, an excellent opportunity to acquire a comprehensive knowledge on education, vocational training, personality development and rehabilitation of the visually challenged.

Keeping with its rich heritage, the college also initiated various curricular and co-curricular activities providing equal opportunities to both seeing and visually challenged students, such as taking part in inclusive sports events, cultural activities etc. The college is an active member of the Equal Opportunity Cell of University of Delhi and the students of the college participate in various co-curricular activities of the university.

The college has a Learning Resource Centre (library) with comprehensive collection of books on special education, particularly on visual impairment. Library has 3435 volumes of print and braille books. More than 100 of back volumes of Periodicals, Research Bulletins, Conference, Proceedings and Reports are available in the library. It also subscribes to 19 National and International journals/periodicals on Education and Special Education. It provides ample opportunity to students and teachers to develop their professional skills and enrich their knowledge.

The library offers approximately 70 titles of audio books to cater the needs of the visually challenged students. Internet facility is also available in the library. For the benefit of print disabled students, the college has the facility of 'Book Share', an on-line digital library. The college also has a resource room equipped with special teaching aids and devices.

It hardly needs emphasizing that College's excellent location and the facilities conveniently available to it, provide the ideal environment for pursuing course in special education with a special focus on visual impairment. The college has close association with various National and International universities offering courses in Special Education, like, JamiaMilliaIslamia, Roehempton University, London, Kurukshetra University, Guru Govind Singh Indraprastha University, RajarshiTandon Open University, Allahabad, Jai Narain Vyas University, Jodhpur, IGNOU, JRHU, Chitrakoot, MP Bhoj University, Banaras Hindu University, etc. The college also provides academic as well as technical consultancy to various institutions in India and abroad. Above all, the College has eminent and highly experienced regular and guest faculties.

B.ED. (SPECIAL EDUCATION - VISUALLY IMPAIRED) 2014-15

B.Ed. (Special Education - Visually Impaired) is one-year degree course under the Faculty of Education, University of Delhi and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. The course is based on the curriculum framed by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) and the University of Delhi.

Admission to the course is open to men and women from all parts of the country. The course is offered at:

Eligibility Conditions:

The eligibility for B. Ed. (Special Education - Visually Impaired) course is B. A. or B. Sc. or an equivalent degree at graduate level with (a) two of the school teaching subjects as the area of study at the bachelor degree level; In case the candidate does not have two school subjects at the lavel of graduation from among the subjects offered in the course, he/ she should have one of them at the 10+2 level, with a minimum of 55% of marks. The candidates would have to choose their methodology papers on this basis.

The eligibility for admission is 50% aggregate in the qualifying degree examination. OBC/SC/ST/Visually disabled/other Physicallydisabled, Widows / Wards of armed forces personnel will be allowed a concession of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility requirements. Relaxation to OBC candidates who belong to 'non-creamy layers' and appear in the 'central list' of OBC as per the notification dated 11/04/2012.

Note:- As per the Supreme Court ruling, candidates belonging to the reserved categories and who have been found eligible for admission in the general merit rank list will be admitted against seats in the general category. The seats for the reserved categories will, then, be filled-up from the remaining candidates in the reserved categories as follows:

The candidates belonging to the reserved categories will compete for the reserved seats among themselves. A final selection list will be prepared on the basis of their performance in the Entrance Test.

In case of non-availability of suitable candidates for the reserved seats, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved and will be filled up accordingly.

All other conditions and requirements of admission for the reserved categories will be the same as for unreserved candidates.

The candidates with the following qualifications are not eligible (for the reason that they have not studied Two school teaching subjects). B.Tech., B.C.A., B.Com., B.B.E., B.B.A., M.B.A., B.A. (Vocational Studies), B.A. (Mass Communication), and any other such degrees.*

*Eligibility of such Degrees that are not mentioned here will be considered by the admission committee at the time of admission, and the decision of the admission committee will be final.

Intake Capacity:

Total Seats - 25

Reservation of Seats (In accordance with Delhi University Guidelines for 2010 admissions)

- (a) Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes (SC/ST) 15% of total number of seats for Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes.
- (b) Other Backward Classes (OBC) 27% additional seats in the light of reservation for OBC as per direction of University of Delhi.
- (c) Physically Disabled 3%
- (d) 25% of the seats will be reserved for candidates offering both Mathematics and Science only as teaching methodology paper subjects to the condition that such candidates obtain at least 55% marks in the entrance test. In case the suitable candidates in this group are not available, the vacant seats will be transferred to other subjects.

Basis of Admission:

The selection of candidates for admission to B.Ed (Special Education -Visually Impaired) will be made on the basis of merit in the entrance examination to be conducted in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Education, University of Delhi.

About the Entrance Test:

All the candidates are required to appear in the entrance test. It consists of two parts.

Part A

(Compulsory for all)

i) Reasoning and General Awareness:

This section would include areas to assess abilities such as reasoning (mathematical, inductive& deductive), identifying and understanding the relationship among various elements decision making, data analysis interpretation etc. This section will also assess the awareness and knowledge of the candidate in the fields of the education, national and international affairs, etc.

ii) Teaching Aptitude and Sensitivity Toward Disability:

This test focuses on assessing sensitivity to issues related to the growing child, School, family and society and probes the candidate's general disposition and attitude towards teaching and issues related to Disability.

iii) Language Comprehension:

The Comprehension Test aims at assessing the candidate's language comprehension Skillsboth in English & in Hindi.

Part B (Two subjects chosen as optional methodology papers)

It comprises of the two subjects chosen by the candidates as their optional methodology papers as per the guidelines given in the Eligibility conditions. This part will assess the content knowledge and analytical abilities in the concerned subjects. The candidates are required to choose from the following five methodology papers offered by the college.

- (a) Teaching of Hindi as first language
- (b) Teaching of English as Second Language
- (c) Teaching of Social Studies
- (d) Teaching of Mathematics
- (e) Teaching of Science

There will be an internal sectional cut-off at 16 marks (i.e. 40%) for each of the sections B (i) and B(ii).

The total duration of the test is 150 minutes. 50 minutes extra time for candidates who are visually impaired.

Note

- 1. All those candidates who have appeared in the final examination leading to any one Of the qualifications mentioned under eligibility conditions and whose results of the Annual Examination -2014 are awaited may also apply. However, they must produce A Provisional Certificate along with their mark-sheets of the required qualification at the time of admission (i.e. submission of fees).

 No Provisional Admission will be given this year.
- 2. OBC candidates are required to submit income certificate while submitting admission form for the course.
- 3. Rounding of fraction is nor allowed while computing the percentage of marks.
- 4. Relaxation in the minimum eligibility conditions for reserved categories is As par ruling of the Government of India.
- 5. The information given by an applicant in the application regarding category-General.

 Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, OBC, Physically Handicapped or Widows/Wards of Armed Forces Personnel-shall be final and no change shall be permitted later on under any circumstances.
- 6. It is to be noted that if a candidate has been allowed to appear in the Entrance Test, it does Not imply that the candidate's eligibility to the programme has been verified. Eligibility Shall be finally verified by the office at the time of admission.
- 7. If at any stage, after verification, it is found that the furnished information is wrong or Inaccurate, or documents produced are fake, the consequences may lead to cancellation of the candidate's Test result/ admission, examination, forfeiture of the tuition fee and degree and even prosecution in appropriate cases.
- 8. A visually impaired candidate, may arrange and engage his/her own scribe as per the Delhi University guidelines in this regard. For details see link www.eoc.du.ac.in
- 9. Candidates who have applied for re-evaluation/improvement of examination results (to take re-appear examination) will also not be considered for provisional admission.

The minimum marks required to pass the examination will be 40% in each (external) theory paper, 45% in aggregate for written (external paper) and internal assessment relating to that paper, 50% in the practical and overall 50% in the aggregate.

Hostel Accommodation: Hostel will be provided only to outstation visually impaired candidates on payment basis as per the availability of hostel seats in both men and women hostel. In case of large number merit in the entrance test will be the deciding factor.

Programme Transaction: The B.Ed. (Special Education- Visually Impaired) programme involves lectures, demonstrations, simulations, peer group learning, tutorials, workshops, community work, discussions, formal observation and practical class room teaching in special as well as inclusive school, study tours/visits and co-curricular activities including physical education.

IV. Medium of Instruction and Examination: Hindi/English.

- V. Teaching Days: The Course will be spread over a period of 180 actual teaching days, i.e. a minimum of 30 weeks of actual teaching in a 6-day week. Of the remaining period, 12 weeks will be devoted to admission and examination activities, and non-instructional days, 8 weeks for vacation and 2 weeks for various public holidays.
- VI. Timings: The working hours are from 10.a.m. to 5 p.m. (Monday to Saturday, except second Saturday). All students are expected to remain whole time in their College. During practice teaching days, all the students are expected to be in the Practicing School for entire duration of the school hours.
- VII. Attendance: Students are expected to attend the classes and other activities regularly. University rules require a minimum of 75% attendance in theory, practical, tutorials and other activities. Leave of absence could be granted with the prior permission only under unavoidable circumstances. Leave application should be addressed to the Course Director/ Principal.
- VIII. Morning Assembly: Morning Assembly is held every day at 9:50 a.m. It is mandatory for all students to attend the morning assembly and other assemblies organized for special occasions.

HOW TO APPLY

- 1. Before filling in the application form, candidates are advised to read the Prospectus carefully and ensure their eligibility for admission, as laid down in the Prospectus.

Incomplete application shall be rejected.

Outstation candidates can pay the Entrance Examination Fee of Rs. 500/- by Demand Draft from any Nationalized Bank in favour of the Executive Secretary, The Blind Relief Association, Delhi, payable at Delhi. Cheques / Money Orders/Postal Orders shall not be accepted. The candidate should write his/her name and Form No. on the reverse of the Demand Draft while sending the application by post. Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances. Candidates should ensure that the application forms are submitted with the following documents attached to the application form in the following order:-

12. Admission to B.Ed will be considered complete subject to the following:
