ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

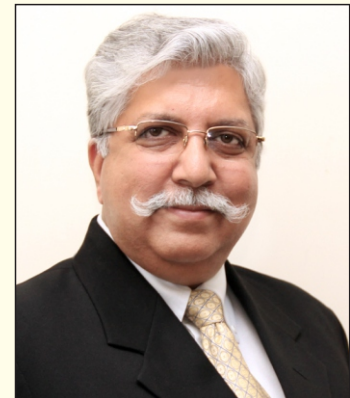
Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab (RGNUL) was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab Act, 2006 (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). RGNUL started functioning at Mohindra Kothi, the Mall, Patiala w.e.f. 26 May 2006. The University acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in August 2006. The University got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and also got recognition under Section 12-B of the said Act. RGNUL is a regular member of Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi and several other prestigious national and international institutions/organizations. **RGNUL is the first National Law University to be accredited with 'A' Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).**

University Campus is at Sidhuwal, Bhadson Road, Patiala in an area of 50 Acres of land. The state-of-the-art Campus has an Administrative-cum-Academic Block, spacious Library Building, Auditorium, Sports Complex, separate Boys and Girls Hostels, Guest House, Health Centre, Residences, Amphitheatre, Gymnasium, Seminar Hall, Moot Court Hall and other facilities. All university building including hostels is air conditioned.

LIBRARY

RGNUL has a well equipped computerized Central Library with more than thirty thousand titles and about one hundred thirteen journals in addition to the specialized libraries of various Research Centres. RGNUL Library is the biggest single subject library in Asia. Library is equipped with RFID and Libsys 7.1

Library Management Software. There are three advanced Computer Labs with high end computers and leased line internet connectivity. The whole RGNUL Campus is wi-fi enabled.

MOOTING AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS

Mooting is one of the premier extra-curricular activities at a law school. It gives the students a first-hand experience of legal research and a glimpse of the real life litigation process. Since Mooting is an integral part of legal education, so with the aim of promoting the moot culture, The University initiated annual, RGNUL National Moot Court Competition. RGNUL has also been organizing different Moot Court Competitions in collaboration with prestigious organisations like Surana & Surana Legal Attorneys including Trial Advocacy Moot and India Rounds, Stetson International Moot Court Competition etc. RGNUL students are regularly participating in various reputed Moot Court Competitions at the National and International level and have displayed exemplary brilliance in the same. In the last academic year, RGNUL qualified for the world rounds of the 19th Stetson International Environmental Law Moot Court Competition and have won many moot court competitions like the 11th Nani Palkhivala Memorial National Tax Moot Court Competition, 2015 and the First NUALS Kochi Securities Law Moot Court Competition, 2015. Students representing the university also bagged a number of other citations like the Best Speaker Award at B.R. Sawhney National Moot Court Competition, 2015 and Best Memorial at NLIU Juris Corp Moot Court Competition, 2015 amongst others.

RGNUL is the only National Law University to have organized TEDx at RGNUL Campus under license from TEDx USA. Law graduates from RGNUL have also been selected for pursuing higher studies in various prestigious universities including the University of Oxford, University of Hamburg, Duisenberg School of Finance, Amsterdam, National University of Singapore, Geneva Institute, Geneva, University of Turin, University of Kent, University of Barcelona, University College, London, University of Bern, University of Exeter etc.

RGNUL alumni has an excellent internship and placement record. The students have done internships with the country's best law firms. RGNUL students have been placed in prestigious law firms like Amarchand Mangaldas, J. Sagar Associates, Suresh A. Shroff & Co., Luthra and Luthra Law Offices, Trilegal, Lakshikumar & Sridharan, Wadia Ghandy & Co, Trident Group etc. apart from being placed in Judicial Services.

RGNUL regularly organizes Seminars, Conferences, Workshops to discuss, update, disseminate and brush up

legal and to sensitize the masses on various themes of national and international significance. In addition, RGNUL also holds national and international essay writing competitions on significant topics.

RGNUL PUBLICATIONS

RGNUL publishes its Law Review (RLR) bi-annually. In addition to RLR, RGNUL publishes Financial and Mercantile Law Review, RGNUL Student Law Review (RSLR), RGNUL Law Review Student Edition and Journal of Social Sciences(RSJ). RGNUL also publishes an annual Working Paper Series on Policy Analysis related to various themes that cater to the interface between Law and Economics. In order to provide quality material on law and other related subjects, RGNUL has also published more than twenty books.

B.A.LL.B. (HONS.) FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED COURSE

RGNUL offers B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Programme whereunder Social Science subjects like Economics, English, History, Political Science and Sociology are taught as major and minor subjects alongwith Law subjects in the first three years of study. From third year onwards, the curriculum comprises of Law subjects and one major subject. All subjects are compulsory in the first three years of study. However, in the fourth and fifth year, students are offered specializations in four streams, viz., Business Law, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law and International Law. The successful students are awarded Honours Degree with specialization.

RGNUL follows the Semester System. The teaching methodology includes extensive and intensive class room teaching with emphasis on participative learning. The courses include assignments, seminars and project work. The thrust of the course is not just on learning but also professional training.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The Admission shall be based exclusively on merit in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). Eligibility criteria shall be as per CLAT 2016 rules.

The candidature of:

- (a) those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and/or fail to produce result on the date of interview/counseling, or
- (b) those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

Candidate applying in the SC/ST/SAP/State Resident category is required to submit category certificate from the competent authority.

The candidature of the Punjab Resident Category shall be determined on submission of an affidavit and a certificate as per the Punjab Government letter No. 1/3/95-3PPII/9619 dated 06.06.96 as amended vide Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms letter No. 11/3/95-3PP-II/80 dated 01.01.99. The format of the Affidavit is available in the prospectus of the University.

Admission to the category of the 'Foreign Nationals' shall be the direct admission on the basis of inter-se merit of the qualifying examination and the interview. These candidates need to apply directly to the Registrar, RGNUL, latest by 31 May 2016.

LL.M. ONE YEAR POST GRADUATION COURSE

The RGNUL offers one-year LL.M. Post Graduation Course with specialization in Business Law, Constitutional Law, Criminal Law and International Law. (Specialization will be offered subject to the condition of minimum ten students opting the same).

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The Admission shall be based exclusively on the merit of the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). The candidate must have passed the LL.B./B.L. Degree examination from Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law or any other University whose degrees are recognized equivalent by this University, with minimum 55% marks (50% marks for SC/ST).

1. Candidates appearing in/awaiting results of the qualifying examination being held in April/May 2016 may also apply and appear provisionally for the Admission Test, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed marks at the time of interview/counselling.
2. The candidature of:
 - (a) those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and/or fail to produce result on the date of interview/counselling, or

- (b) those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

Candidate applying in the SC/ST/SAP category is required to submit category certificate from the competent authority.

Scholarships
