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CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT

(including Student Placement Agreement)

You must enrol according to a recommended study plan provided. In addition you agree to discuss any deviation from the specified study plan with the ALU in writing via email alu@cdu.edu.au.

This course is subject to enrolment conditions. A national shortage of undergraduate nursing clinical placement means that the ability of the University to provide the clinical placement component of the course is subject to availability of clinical places in the healthcare sector.

Charles Darwin University (CDU) has agreements with various health care agencies/facilities across Australia (Agency) which enable the placement of students for the practical placement (placement) required for the program in which they are enrolled. Prior to CDU organising a placement for you in an Agency, you are required to read and sign this Student Placement Agreement. This document describes your responsibilities to CDU and the Agency during your placement(s) and other important information of which you should be aware. The Agency may place additional requirements upon you as part of your placement

Your decision to enrol in the Bachelor of Nursing (Pre-registration) is an agreement to accept the following conditions:

- You agree to undertake the clinical placement component of the program at the time and place designated by the University;
- You have read the *Pre-Clinical Requirement, Simulation Block (SB) and Clinical Placement Information* contained within this booklet; therefore, your continuing enrolment in the course is an agreement to accept the conditions surrounding SBs and clinical placements;
- You have enrolled according to a study plan contained within this booklet;
- You agree to discuss any deviation from the specified study plan with the ALU in writing (when swapping/changing units) via email to ehseoffice@cdu.edu.au, or by post to the following address:

- Learning materials are provided to students in an online environment via Learnline, CDU's iteration of the Blackboard LMS. It is therefore essential for you to have access to a reliable desk top or lap computer with internet/broadband access to successfully complete units in this course.

ENROLMENT IN THE BACHELOR OF NURSING (PRE-REGISTRATION) AGREEMENT:

1. I will not attempt to find my own placement without prior approval of the University. I will not contact health facilities or other universities to discuss possible placement availability and options.

2. Prior to the placement I will:
 - a. undertake all of the necessary immunisations and health screening relating to my degree and provide CDU with evidence of completion;
 - b. advise CDU and the Agency of any medical or health conditions that may affect my ability to perform the duties required by the placement or complete the placement;
 - c. provide CDU with a National Police Check that is less than twelve months old and will not expire before or during the placement;
 - d. provide CDU with a current Working with Children Check (and/or criminal screening as per state or territory requirements);
 - e. register with the relevant registration body if required (disciplines other than nursing);
 - f. Nursing students will automatically be registered with AHPRA by the education provider.

Under the National Law, information about students will be entered on the Student Register. This information is not published online and is not publicly available. The information AHPRA requests from education providers include:

- Name of Education Provider
- Student's name
- Student ID number
- Student's date of birth
- Student's gender
- Student' mailing address in Australia and email details
- Name of approved program of study or clinical training
- The date on which the student is expected to complete the approved program of study or clinical training
- For students that have completed or otherwise ceased to be enrolled in the approved program of study or clinical training, the date of the completion or cessation, and
- The reason why the student completed or otherwise ceased to be enrolled in the approved program of study or clinical training.

No fee applies to student registration

3. I acknowledge that:
 - a. CDU will inform the Agency that a National Police Check (and where applicable, a Working with Children Check and/ or criminal screening as per state or territory requirements) has been obtained;
 - b. In the event that the National Police check (and where applicable, Working with Children Check and/ or criminal screening as per state or territory requirements) discloses a court outcome, charge or matter under investigation, CDU will provide the Agency with a certified copy of the National Police check (and where applicable, the Working with Children Check and/ or criminal screening as per state or territory requirements)), as required by the Agency agreement, and CDU and the Agency will decide whether I can undertake the placement;
 - c. my preclinical documents maybe provided and may be held on file by CDU and/or the Agency.

4. I will notify CDU and the Agency if the status of my police record (and where applicable, *Working with Children Check* and/or criminal screening as per state or territory requirements) changes prior to or during the course of the placement.

5. During the placement I will:
 - a. commit myself fully to the work involved in the placement and conduct myself responsibly as a student of CDU;
 - b. notify both CDU and the Agency if, for any reason, I am unable to attend all, or part of the placement;
 - c. immediately inform both CDU and the Agency of any accident or incident in which I am involved during placement hours;
 - d. only accept assignment of duties which are commensurate with my level of skill and ability;
 - e. work within my scope of practice as a CDU student;
 - f. neither be employed by the Agency nor receive any remuneration or other entitlement as a result of my placement.
 - g. not allow my personal employment to impact on placement;
 - h. not drive a Northern Territory Government vehicle.

6. During the placement, I will comply with:
 - a. all occupational, health, safety and welfare legislation;
 - b. all reasonable instructions from CDU and the Agency. The Agency provides the final instruction on matters of client/patient care or service;
 - c. all policies, procedures and regulations of CDU and the Agency, including CDU academic and disciplinary policies.

7. I acknowledge that:
 - a. I have read and understand the CDU Student Code of Conduct By-Laws and will abide by them <http://www.cdu.edu.au/governance/>
 - b. The Agency may refuse the request for my placement;
 - c. The Agency may terminate my placement prior to the start date;

- d. I am responsible for demonstrating appropriate behaviour while in the Agency, particularly concerning privacy and confidentiality of client/patient's records and all other Agency related information and matters. I will not disclose what I see or hear, or pass on information from written records concerning any client/patient, except for the purposes of client/patient care or service. I will not discuss clients/patients publicly, either within or outside the Agency. If confidentiality is breached, the penalty may include termination of my placement;
- e. any client/patient of the Agency has a right to refuse to be my client/patient or to be subject to my care or service;
- f. my placement may be terminated by CDU at any time if my performance or conduct is not satisfactory or if I have breached any of the terms of this Agreement;
- g. My placement may be terminated by the Agency at any time if my performance or conduct is not satisfactory or if I have breached any of the terms of this Agreement. This right will not be exercised without prior discussion with CDU, except in extraordinary circumstances;
- h. my placement may be terminated if I have not supplied my pre-clinical documents by the specified deadline;
- i. I must disclose to CDU any other matter arising prior to or at any time during the placement that may reasonably be seen to impact upon my ability to carry out the placement.

To my knowledge, there is no reason why I should not undertake the Placement.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT CLINICAL PLACEMENT UNITS

The following must be read in conjunction with point two in the Conditions of Enrolment.

Prior to enrolling in any clinical placement units, students will be required to complete a nomination process. Online nomination and subsequent confirmation of assignment to a SB and/or placement does not constitute enrolment in a placement unit. Enrolment in a placement unit is a separate process and is the responsibility of the student.

Students who are not enrolled in their placement unit are not eligible to undertake any part of that placement unit. Applications for late enrolment will only be granted if approved by the unit or placement coordinator.

Important information about the nomination process, important contacts and a resource manual for students undertaking a placement unit can be found on the CDU web under School of Health /Health Placements. Please be aware that it is your responsibility to organise your own travel and accommodation arrangements and meet all associated costs with clinical placement units.

Pre-clinical Requirements

As a Bachelor of Nursing student at Charles Darwin University (CDU), you are required to submit all pre-clinical documentation specific to your State or Territory. Students should ensure that all pre-clinical documentation is provided by day one of semester two in the first year of study at CDU if a full time student, or, if a part time student, by day one of the semester you enrol in to a placement unit. Pre-clinical requirements must remain current for the duration of the placement. A clinical placement will not be negotiated for you if the required documentation is not supplied by the submission date and not kept up to date during your studies. This may impact on your course progression. Review the website prior to any clinical placement unit as requirements may be updated to comply with contractual obligations.

Please be aware that it may take up to 3 months to obtain some documentation and state and territory requirements are subject to change.

Simulation Block (SB) Information

Prior to attending a clinical placement, you must successfully complete a 5-day SB during which time you will practice and be assessed on the skills required to undertake your placement. Successful completion of the NUR343 SB is a pre-requisite for undertaking NUR344 and NUR346 placements. In the event that you fail the placement component of NUR343, prior to commencing NUR344 and or NUR346 you will be required to re-enrol in NUR343 and/or NUR344 and NUR346, including nominating and successfully completing the SB when the unit is next available for enrolment. The custom built clinical suites at Melbourne, Alice Springs and Darwin campuses provide an opportunity for you to meet other students and nursing staff, while exposing you to aspects of Primary Health Care in the NT.

Clinical Placement Information

Students may nominate for a placement in their own state or territory at a preferred health care facility, but are not permitted to arrange their own placement/s.

CDU has strong ties with both private and public health care facilities throughout Australia and has successfully placed students in all states and territories; however, due to the demand made on interstate health care facilities by many educational institutions, many facilities are now limiting the number of placements they offer and this may impact on course progression.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the extreme shortage of clinical placements, CDU cannot guarantee that interstate students will undertake all placements in their home state.

Whilst every effort will be made to meet a request for a preferred facility within the semester for which the student is enrolled, CDU reserves the right to place students at a facility other than that which is nominated and outside the semester for which they have enrolled.

A fail grade may be issued for noncompliance of pre-clinical documents prior to attending placement, cancellation of placement less than two weeks prior to the first day without providing satisfactory evidence, failure to attend placement without communication with CDU, or liaising with a facility to organise a placement.

NUR344: Nursing Practice 4	On-line Theory 160 hours clinical community setting
NUR346: Transition to Practice 2	On-line Theory 160 hours clinical placement
Total Clinical Placement Hours = 880 - Accumulated over the duration of the course	

STUDY PLAN INFORMATION

The Bachelor of Nursing Pre-registration (BNRSG) is designed to facilitate appropriate student progression (unit sequencing in the study plan builds upon the knowledge that is obtained in a previous semester/year). The Faculty advises all students to follow one of the study plans contained in this information package as any deviation is likely to increase the course duration (extend the completion time for the course). Any deviation from the study plan should be discussed with the ALU prior to enrolling in units to minimise the impact of any deviation from the recommended study plan.

APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION/ADVANCED STANDING/CREDIT TRANSFER

Students that wish to apply for exemption/advanced standing/credit transfer (CT) based on incomplete nursing studies (e.g. studied nursing units at another institution), or have professional qualifications, are required to complete the [HE113 - Application for Exemption](#) form. It is important to note that applications for CT can take up to 2 weeks to be processed, and will not be assessed without all relevant supporting documentation.

Please ensure that your application is submitted prior to the commencement of your first semester with sufficient time to be assessed and processed as your course progression may be affected*.

Please Note: A true certified copy of your academic transcript, key to grades and unit outlines (document detailing the learning outcomes) must be supplied with your completed form as applications without supporting documentation will not be processed.

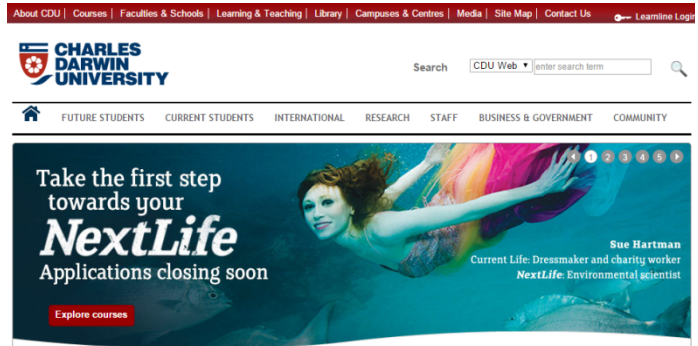
The university does not accept photocopied, faxed or scanned versions of a certified document, please post your application to the address provided on the HE113 form.

When applying for credit, students are required to identify the BNRSG units for which they are seeking credit. The following steps may assist students in their search:

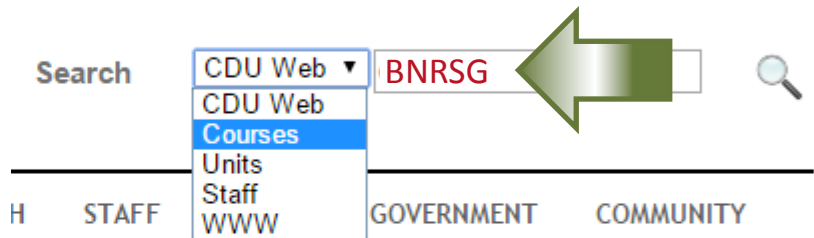
Step One
